Grain shipping rules will not affect local delivery

Wednesday the Kansas Corporation Commission has released a new policy excluding farmers and ranchers from interstate trucking regulations if they are delivering agricultural commodities to local grain elevators and sale barns.

Moran met with the state officials last week to discuss the proposed regulations that would affect farmers hauling grain to local elevators.

The Kansas Corporate Commission released its interpretation on Wednesday that commodity shipments within the borders of Kansas will not be considered interstate commerce unless there is clear evidence the shipper intends for the commodity to leave the state.

many farmers and ranchers who ficials told Moran that the rule was deliver agricultural commodities to local grain elevators and sale barns will not be subject to federal regulations. "I ampleased the state acted quickly

to change its interpretation of this regulation," Moran said. "Had the state not made this change, it would have placed burdensome regulations on most of our Kansas farmers and ranchers. I thank them for their prompt attention to this matter and decision to do the right thing.'

The state was proposing to consider the transportation of grain from a Kansas farm to a local elevator as interstate commerce since the grain may ultimately be sold to ered intrastate commerce."

Moran said the change means that an out-of-state buyer. The state ofto comply with federal rules, rather than safety concerns.

The new policy says, "... if there is no clear evidence that the farmershipper's intent as respects the movement of the items in commerce is one of interstate transport, that intent shall not be inferred. For the purpose of this policy, intrastate carrier is defined as a carrier who operates solely in intrastate commerce and does not transport placardable quantities of hazardous materials. If the operation is solely within the state of Kansas and the commerce engaged in is solely within the state of Kansas, the shipment is consid-
