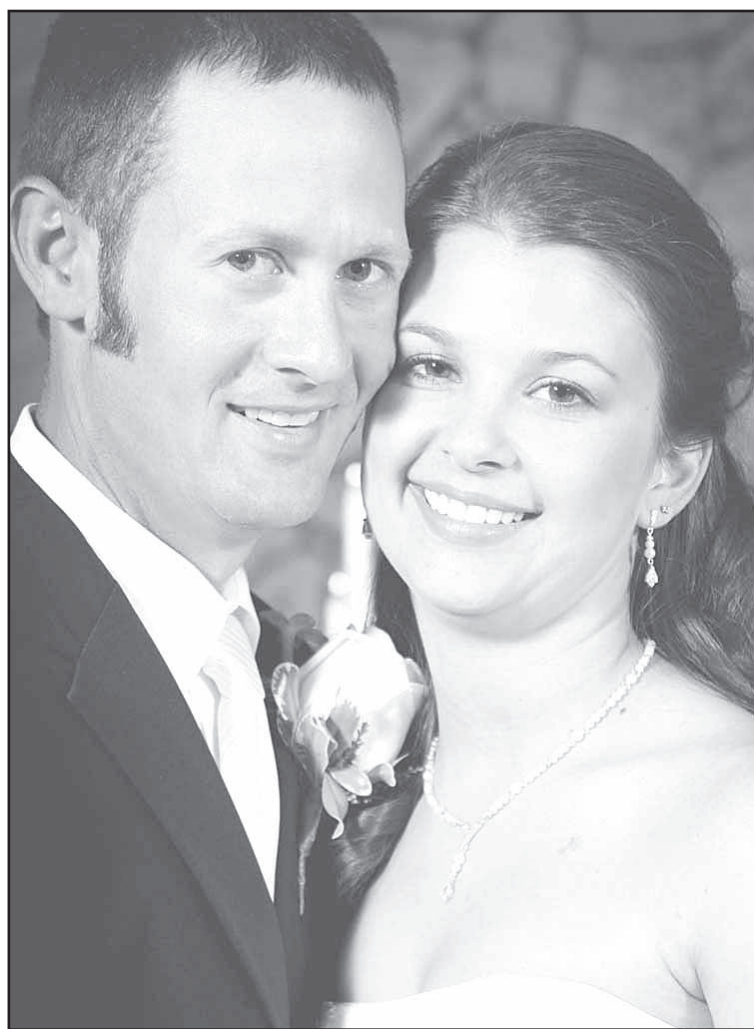

The groom graduated from Goodland High School in 1998 and from Kansas State University with a degree in elementary education. He is a math teacher and coach for the Sublette School District.

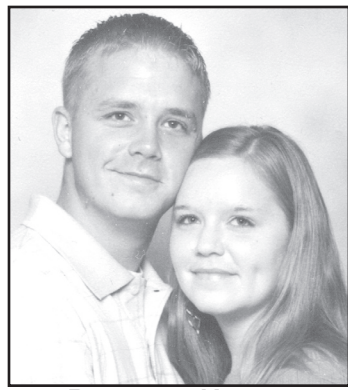
The couple honeymooned in Hawaii and will live in Sublette.
