Cowgirls end season with 62-38 loss

The Cowgirls basketball season ended Monday with a 62-38 loss to the Kingman Lady Eagles in the first round of the Class 4A substate

tournament in Kingman. The Cowgirls finish with a 6-15 record while the Kingman Lady Eagles (9-12) moved on to the second round.

Kingman had the unenviable task on Thursday of facing the undefeated Colby Lady Eagles (21-0), who defeated Russell (0-21) 97-25, at Colby in the first round.

The Colby Lady Eagles, the defending Class 4A state champions, are ranked second in the state behind Andover Central (21-0). Colby is riding a 28-0 winning streak, including the last part of last year. The last Eagles loss was Feb. 17, 2007, when the Cowgirls beat them 55-50.

Against Kingman, the Cowgirls got off to a slow start in the first quarter. Kingman's senior Lindsey Smith got hot and hit three threepoint baskets in the quarter to give the Lady Eagles a 17-4 lead.

Smith kept up her scoring in the second quarter with another threepoint basket, the fourth of the five she made, plus a field goal in the third quarter for 17 points. Smith had been averaging about 5 points a game, and Cowgirls Coach Don Smith said she was not one of the top shooters he was expecting to cause the Cowgirls trouble.

Coach Smith said when the Cowgirls did not get a good start in the first quarter this year, they have struggled. Games where the Cowgirls had good first quarters were much closer, and a couple of them came down to last-second

The Cowgirls were down 29-10 at the half, being out scored 12-6 in the second quarter. In the half, the Cowgirls hit just 15 percent of their shots and made only 4 of 15 free throws.

For the Eagles, senior Andi Miller had eight of her 17 points in the first half. She was the team's leading scorer with an average of 12 points

In the second half, the Cowgirls started to get to the basket, scoring 14 points in each quarter to finish with 38. However, the Eagles scored 18 points in the third and 15 in the fourth for 62.


