Against Nickerson, the Cowboys had trouble getting baskets. Neither team, it seemed, could hang onto the ball, and the turnovers kept the score down.

In the first quarter, the Cowboys found themselves down 5-1 with senior Josh Doke scoring their only point on a free throw. It got worse, as the Panthers built an 11-1 lead before junior Travis Angelos got a steal and a layup for his only points of the game. The first quarter ended with the Panthers leading 12-3.


