

Cowboys fourth at home

Goodland leader gets eighth

The Cowboys golf team finished fourth in their home tournament at Sugar Hills Golf Club on Tuesday.

"We had a beautiful day for the meet," said Cowboys coach Terry Daise. "Our play was lacking consistency on our home course, but it's early in the season."

Goodland scored 351 strokes for fourth, with Hays High winning with a team score of 328. Ulysses was second with 347 and Colby third at 349. Daise said 12 teams competed at Sugar Hills.

Individually, junior Joel Weis led the Cowboys, winning the eighth-place medal with an 18-hole score of 85.

Darrick Ihrig placed, just out of the medals, with a round of 87. Junior Drew Raile shot an 89, Ross Townsend 90 and Erick Linnell and Andrew Taylor each had 93.

"Townsend improved a lot from this first meet at Norton," Daise said, "and it was good to see Weis get his second straight top-10 finish."

The team was at Norton last Friday, where squad finished second and Weis took second individually.

The tournament drew 12 teams, with Phillipsburg winning with a team score of 338. The Cowboys finished second at 358.

Weis shot an 82. Raile won a playoff for the 10th-place medal after shooting a 92. Ihrig and Linnell were tied with Raile at 92. Townsend shot a 104, and Tyler Jones 120.

Daise said he thought for the first meet, the boys did well to take second.

He will be taking a few varsity players to Oberlin on Saturday for a tournament beginning at 8:30 a.m.

The Cowboys will be in Hays on Monday for a meet at 2 p.m.

The Cowboys will hold their annual junior varsity tournament at 1 p.m. Tuesday at Sugar Hills.

Underclassmen hold track meet

Goodland's freshmen and sophomores were hosts for a home meet Monday, with the young Cowboys finishing third out of nine teams and the Cowgirls fifth out of seven.

The girls snared two first-place medals, one second and four thirds, including a first-place for a relay team and a third.

The Cowboys had two firsts, three seconds and three thirds, including a second-place relay team and two thirds.

For the boys, first-place medals went to freshman Brock Wilkens for the high jump, 5'5", and freshman Nathan Deeds for finishing the 200-meter dash in 26.07 seconds.

Earning second were Wilkens, finishing the 110-meter high hurdles in 18.1 seconds; freshman Talison Crosby for finishing the 3,200-meter run in 13 minutes, 34.07 seconds; and the 4X400-meter relay team, finishing in 4 minutes, 36.6 seconds.

Sophomore Jay Cotter was third in shot put, 39' 4.25". The 4X800-meter relay team was third in 10 minutes, 32.43 seconds, and the 4X100-meter relay team was third in 50.55 seconds.

Cotter was fourth in discus, 102' 2", and Deeds took fourth in the 100-meter dash, 12.53 seconds. Freshman Victor Diaz was sixth in the 100-meter dash, 12.57.

Deeds was fifth in the long jump, 16' 1.25", and freshman Kelly Pearson was sixth, 15'

11". Pearson was fifth in high jump, 4' 10", and sophomore Ben Waugh was fifth in pole vault, 7'. Freshman Stephen Buller finished sixth in the 800-meter run, 2 minutes, 44.54 seconds.

The boys had 78.5 points for third, behind Limon and St. Francis, who tied with 115. Greeley County (Tribune) was fourth with 65.5, followed by Burlington with 46, Colby and Oakley, each with 41.5, Hoxie with 10 and Ulysses with nine.

For the girls, sophomore Alexis Bateman took first in long jump, 14' 3.5", and the 4X400-meter relay team won in 5 minutes, 11.79 seconds.

Freshman Jade Herl was second in the 400-meter dash in 1 minute, 15.05 seconds. Freshman Christy Studer finished third in the 1,600-meter run in 7 minutes, 8.07 seconds, and third in the 3,200-meters in 16 minutes, 58.34 seconds. The 4X100-meter relay team took third in 59.27 seconds.

Bateman took third in the 200-meters in 31.03 seconds, and freshman Jennifer Rome came in fourth in 31.72. Rome was fourth in the 100-meter dash in 14.52 seconds, and Herl fifth in 14.69.

The girls earned 60 points for fifth place. First went to Colby with 104, second to Ulysses with 84, third to Burlington with 81.5 and fourth to St. Francis with 78. Oakley was sixth with 33 and Hoxie seventh with 16.5.
