Reporter, author to speak in Colby

Investigative reporter and author Ted Gup will give the Dr. Max Pickerill Lecture at Colby Community College at 6 p.m. (Mountain Time) Tuesday at the Cultural Arts Center.

Gup has written two books about intelligence and the culture of secrecy. His latest, "Nation of Secrets: the Threat to Democracy and the American Way of Life," talks about the causes and casualties of obsessive secrecy.

He argues that the growing preoccupation with secrets in many institutions (not just government) undermines the the values in whose name secrecy is invoked.

His first book, "The Book of Honor: Covert Lives and Classified Deaths at the CIA," uncovered some of the CIA's secrets, including names and stories of undercover operatives killed in the line of duty.

Gup is the Shirley Wormser Professor of Journalism at Case Western Reserve University in Ohio and a former staff writer for The Washington Post and Time magazine. He has been a Pulitizer Prize finalist, a Fulbright Scholar, a MacArthur Grantee and a Guggenheim Fellow.


