





"They all did really well," said Sponsor Sarah Short, "just not quite high enough to go to nationals. Only the top gold score goes to nationals."


The Goodland club has been active in community service, Short said, and Goodland had a lot of parents and FCCLA alumni helping at the showcase.

They also helped unload the "Feed the Children" truck, she said, a national proj-


