
Today, we pick-up on last week's column about putting other things before God in our life. Paul admonishes in 1 Corinthians 10:14,



"Therefore, my dear friends, flee from idolatry." In other words we are starting early today. You are need to run for our lives from the things that would try to replace God from being number one.

Last week we established the issue Paul is getting after in this text is, what do you value most in your life? Whatever you value most in your life is the driving force of your life. So what is in the driver's seat?

If you value your liberties more than God, then that will be the driving force in your life. What you value most will determine your decisions, not to mention your destiny. Today, let's look at four things that happen in a person's life when they allow something other than God to

I am pretty sure God isn't that impressed with attendance if He doesn't have your heart. When we let things in the place of God, ultimately we will stop serving God. A good question to ask ourselves, is, "Are these decisions God based or me based?"

Jesus knows human nature. After and loving. all He was right there when the universe was created. He is God

very God! Matthew 6:24 says, "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.

The word service implies full time service. You can't serve money full time, and serve God full time. When we allow other things to control our life, then our service to God is stopped. Let's be honest we have all seen that in our life haven't we?

Another thing that happens is we lose the ability to discern the issues of life. We lose the ability to keep first things first and we become like the thing we worship. Psalm 135:15-16 tells us that. That is one of the reasons God wants us to worship Him, because He wants us to become like Him. To be good, per-

A third reason not to allow something to replace God in your life is you forfeit peace. Sinful nature is never satisfied, it never has enough, and human tendency is to try to provide for ourselves all the things we think we need. Matthew 6:25-27 gives us great perspective on this. Just a few verses down from there Jesus says, "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Isaiah 26:3 offers this incredible exhortation, "You will keep in perfect peace him whose mind is steadfast, because He trusts in you."

I don't have time to go into the last reason to flee, but you've seen it throughout the pages of Scripture and family histories recount it as well. When we allow something other than God to be the most important thing in our life our family suffers. Here is the reality we all fect, holy, full of peace, righteous, know, but don't like to own up to

all the time. You and my decisions affect other people.

Let me ask you — what is it in your life that is worth hanging onto and forfeiting the blessing of God. A Poet said it this way: "One by one God asked them of me. All the things I valued most. Till I was empty handed and every glittering toy was lost, and I walk earths high grieving in my poverty till I heard His voice inviting, "Lift those empty hands to me." I turned my hands to heaven till He filled them with the store of His riches till they could contain no more. At last I comprehended with my mind – stupid and dull that God could not pour His riches into hands that were already full.'


