Institute of Health (NIH) recently reported that people inherit the ability to produce certain amounts of an anxiety reducing molecule called "neuropepetide Y." This indicates the presence of a genetic factor in regards to a person's level of anxiety. Scientists led by Dr. David Goldman at the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism identified gene variants that affect the release of the neuropeptide, a molecule that is induced by stress and subsequently reduces anxiety. This discovery could help to explain why some people can withstand stress better than others, based on their inherited level of the ability to produce the neuropepetide.
