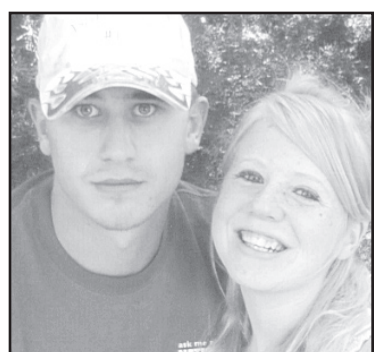
Couple plan August wedding

Arkansas City wedding planned

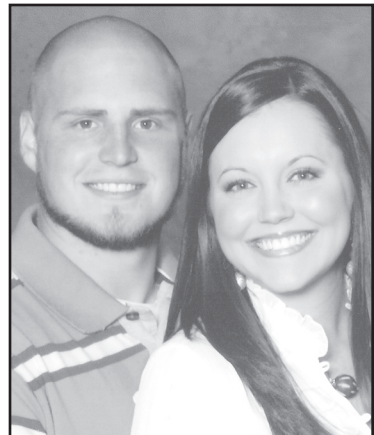
