



Demo Derby cars crash, smash way to victory

Twenty-four cars, twice the number for last year, entered the two demolition derby classes in the annual Goodland Kiwanis Club smashup Saturday night at the fairgrounds arena.

The classes were for cars from 1980 and older and 1980 and newer. There were 12 in each class and heats of six cars determined who made the main event.

The opening heats saw drivers smash into each other, and even some of the heat winners had to be hauled out of the arena.

The Kiwanis announcer, lawyer Jeff Mason, said they had a good crowd, adding that he had never seen so many car parts littering the arena.

Winner in the 1980-and-older class was Mitch Griffin (car 44) of Colby. Second went to Jerome Humrich (311) in a station wagon and Neal Thornburg (26) of Goodland took third.

Kiwanis member Steve Sitton of Finley Motors said each class had a Mad Dog award the judges chose as the most aggressive driver, and Blake Saint (55) of Goodland was the winner.

In the class from 1980 and newer, the winner was Mike Zimmerman (2) with Jerod Smades (43) second.

T.J. Yarger (33) third. Smades won the Mad Dog award from the judges.

Mason said only two cars made it back to the slop heat for the 80s-and-under class, while the 80s-and-over had four.

He said many of the cars were so banged up in the first heats it only took a single hit to put them out in the slop heat. Andrew Drennan of Goodland won one of the slop heats, he said, and Yarger the other.

Mason said the club sponsors the Hamburger Shack and Demo Derby at the fair to make money for its community projects. The group, chartered in 1949, last year gave over \$5,000 in scholarships to Goodland High School graduates and to students attending Northwest Kansas Technical College.

Kiwanis provided about \$15,000 in financial help to Goodland schools and their clubs and organizations, Genesis, the Carnegie Arts Center, the Goodland Library Summer Reading Program, Project Graduation and many other community projects, he said.

"Without the support of the Kiwanis Hamburger shack and Demo Derby," Mason said, "the club could not do what is does for the community."

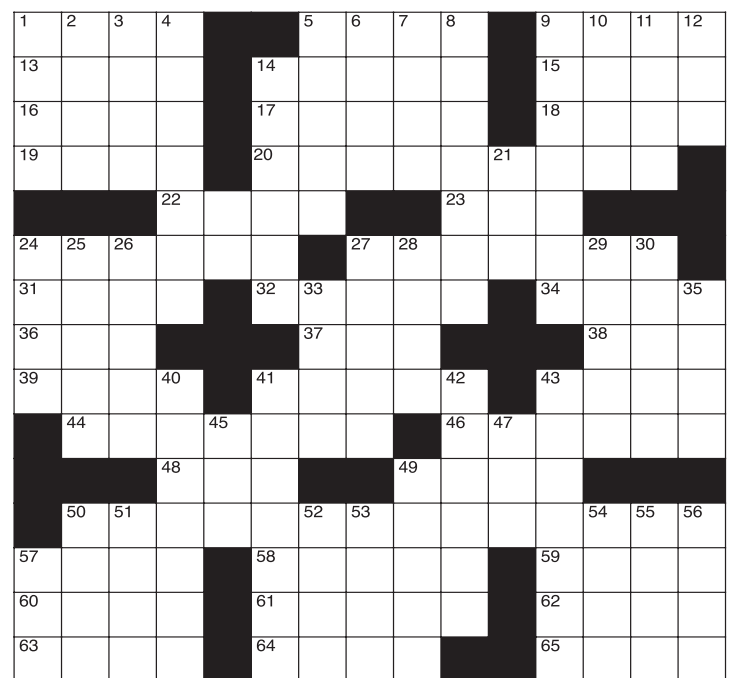
