# Graduate to play two sports at Bethany

A Goodland High graduate has signed to play two sports at Bethany College in Lindsborg, receiving both athletic and academic schol-

Tanner Smith, son of Gary and Deb Smith of Goodland, agreed to play baseball and basketball at Bethany. His scholarships for the two sports and for academics total \$11,000, \$1,000 for basketball, \$1,500 for baseball and \$8,500 for academics, Smith said, renewable for four years.

Clair Oleen, basketball coach at Bethany, said he found out about Smith from former Goodland High teacher and coach Jon McLean, a Bethany graduate.

"He coached at Brewster," Oleen said, "and then was my assistant for a year. I found out about Tanner

Smith visited Bethany last year, Oleen said, practiced with the team and fit right in. He played inside at Goodland, the coach said, and is a hard-nosed kid.

"He will probably be what we call a three-type player," Oleen said; "he plays well inside but will also be on the perimeter and will do a lot of rebounding."


