The first day of international competition, Butts said, they bowled six games, competing against 33 teams in the parent/youth division. The parent/teen division also had 33 teams, she said.

At the end of the day, the pair was in fifth place, among the top eight that would go to the semifinals. They bowled eight games baker's style, she said, which means the youth would bowl the first frame, the parent the second, alternating through the games.

They were in second at the end of the semifinals and bowled against the third place team but lost, ending in third. Since the other team won, she said, they faced and qualified for regional competition in the team that was first in the semi-finals to

Their trophy will arrive in the mail, since they couldn't bring it home on the plane. Butts said they took their bowling balls on the plane but checked their bags when traveling to the competition.
