

Sign-up begins for tickets to see Obama acceptance speech

Kansans can sign up today through Wednesday for tickets to see Sen. Barack Obama accept the Democratic nomination for President At Invesco Mile-High stadium in Denver on Thursday, Aug. 28.

The Kansas Democratic Party has a limited number of tickets and a sign-up to be entered into a random drawing for those tickets began on Monday.

"Sen. Obama has brought thousands of new Kansans into the Democratic Party and into the political process — people who may never have voted in an election before or

taken part in a Convention," said Kansas Democratic Party Chair Larry Gates.

"Obama is opening the doors of the Democratic National Convention to all the voters united behind his campaign for change and the Kansas Democratic Party is excited to help him offer this opportunity to voters across our state."

All Kansans are eligible to enter the drawing to win two tickets to this historic event Gates said. To enter the drawing call the Kansas Democratic Party at (785) 234-0426, ext. 105, or by sign up at the

The phone line will be open, Monday through Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Walk-in reservations will be accepted from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. starting on Monday and ending Wednesday.

Winners of the random drawing will be notified on Thursday. Ticket winners will be contacted and arrangements can be made to pick up the tickets on Saturday and Sunday. Winners will be responsible for their own lodging and transportation to and from Denver.

"The State Library of Kansas has offered digital audio book downloads for some time, however, we are thrilled to add popular platforms," said Christie Brandau, State Librarian. "When the State Library launched Audio Books, Music and More in 2006, access for iPods was unavailable due to certain digital

rights management, but bringing down barriers is what we're about at the State Library of Kansas. Now all residents be able to enjoy digital downloads of award-winning books, music and videos."

Last year, over 74,000 titles were checked out of the library's digital audio collection, and use continues to climb. In June, 2,100 library users downloaded items from the collection. The online Audio Books, Music and More site includes more than 4,000 books and other items — 1,000 items in the new MP3 format.

"And, the selection of items from Audio Books, Music and More will continue to expand as the State Library and libraries across Kansas add titles," said Brandau.

The State Library of Kansas is located in the State Capitol building in Topeka. Although the Library's services have changed and adapted over the years, it is the library's mission to serve the citizens of Kansas. In early statehood years, the Library offered traveling library materials to reach rural Kansans. As a ready resource to the executive and legislative branches of state government, the State Library has served as depository of legal and historical documents.
