

Cowboys prepare for football season

New coach takes helm this week

The Cowboys and Cowgirls teams began preparing for a new season of fall sports Monday, the first day for high school practice in Kansas.

The football team has a new coach, replacing Jonathan Dansel, who resigned to work on the family farm near Weskan.

Kent Teeter, who graduated from Lyons High School and Bethany College at Lindsborg, has the whistle and clipboard this fall. He was a graduate assistant at Fort Hays State University and an assistant football and track coach. Teeter coached at Hays High School for 17 years and then last year was an assistant football coach at Great Bend. The Panthers won eight games and lost three.

Teeter also was hired to teach physical education, health and weight training. Assistants will be Joseph Sramek, who teaches business at the high school; Donald Raymer, who teaches math at Goodland High; Devlin Mull, elementary physical education teacher; and Michael Ruhs, who works in construction.

The football and cross country Soap Scrimmage will be at 6 p.m. Friday, Aug. 29, at Cowboys Stadium. Those attending are encouraged to bring a bar of soap or bottle of body wash for the team showers.

The team will open the season against the Oakley Plainsmen at 6 p.m. Friday, Sept. 5, at home. They play the Eagles in Colby at 6 p.m. Friday, Sept. 12, and the Indians in St. Francis at 6 p.m. Friday, Sept. 19.

The Cowboys will be back home Friday, Sept. 26, to play WaKeeney at 6 p.m., then play the Rawlins County Buffaloes at 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 3, in Atwood, and then for homecoming take on the Oberlin Red Devils from Oberlin at 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 10.

Friday, Oct. 17, they face Scott City at 6:30 p.m. on the road, then return home to face Ness City-Dighton at 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 24, and close the regular season against Norton at 6 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 30.
