The football team has a new coach, replacing Jonathan Dansel, who resigned to work on the family farm near Weskan.

He was a graduate assistant at Fort Hays State University and an assistant football and track coach. Teeter coached at Hays High School for 17 years and then last year was an assistant football coach at Great Bend. The Panthers won eight games and lost three.

The Cowboys will be back home Friday, Sept. 26, to play WaKeeney at 6 p.m., then play the Rawlins County Buffaloes at 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 3, in Atwood, and then for homecoming take on the Oberlin Red Devils from Oberlin at 6 p.m. Friday, Oct. 10.
