## Goodland graduate helps new freshmen

A 2007 Goodland High School graduate is one of 25 "peer educators" selected to mentor students in University of Kansas Learning Communities.

Michael Smith, a sophomore preparing to enter business school and son of Celia Smith of Goodland, will serve as an academic mentor and adviser to students enrolled in a "learning community."

Peer educators also help first-year students transition to college life and assist upper-level students in exploring majors and professions.

Each learning community typically comprises about 20 students enrolled in two courses and a seminar that focus on a theme. Each has a faculty facilitator and a peer educator. The peer educator facilitates academic connections among the linked courses and organizes study groups and programming.

Students enroll in learning communities based on their majors, courses taken or experiences related to the theme. For fall, about 20 are available. Courses can be used to

fulfill requirements in most colleges and professional schools.

Learning communities may be residential or nonresidential. In residential communities, the participants and peer educator live on the same floor in student housing. Students in nonresidential communities may live either on or off campus, and the peer educator arranges times for study groups and social activities.

Of the 25 peer educators hired for the coming school year, two are returning from last year: Lauren Fitzpatrick, a junior from Leawood, and Clarissa Unger, a senior from Colby. Unger also was a peer educator in 2006.

The program began in fall 2003 as part of the Academic Achievement and Access Center within the Student Success program.

Activities for Learning Communities students are scheduled to begin today, during Hawk Week, before fall classes start. For more information, go to www.lc.ku.edu.
