

Cowboys to scrimmage Friday night

The Cowboys have been working out with weights through the summer, getting to know their new football coach and working on some new things for this season.

The team will take the field at 6 p.m. Friday for the annual Soap Scrimmage, 55 members strong with 13 seniors, eight juniors, 13 sophomores and 21 freshmen.

Coach Kent Teeter and assistants Joseph Sramek, Devlin Mull, Donald Raymer and Mike Ruhs have been working with the team on drills and teaching them to work with a no-huddle offense.

"We'll see how it goes," Teeter said of the no-huddle plan. "We're gonna do some things people haven't seen before."

Right now, he said, the team is in the learning process, and that makes you a little slow and makes you mess up a lot. Once you can play without thinking so much, he said, that helps.

There is a lot of talent on the team, he said, a lot of ability and a big senior class. And it's a good coaching staff, he added.

"I'm really excited about the staff," Teeter said. "We work really well together. We have a good base of different experiences on our team."

The coach moved to Goodland June 6 and has worked with the boys in the weight room since, taking them to a couple of camps.

"I thought we had a good summer in the weight room," he said.

The team went to a week-long football camp without pads, he said, and a half-week camp where they scrimmaged with full teams in pads.

"That helped us to see what we're dealing with," he said. "We have a lot of ups and downs. We work hard, but I think we can work harder."

Teeter, who coached last year in Great Bend and the previous 17 in Hays, said he is glad to be in Goodland.

"I've enjoyed Goodland so far," he said. "It's a good community. I have two kids in school, a fifth-grader and a first-grader, and they have loved it so far."

Teeter said he is glad to have the opportunity to coach here and looks forward to working to meet the town's expectations for the team.

"We do have a lot of high expectations," he said. "That's why I came here. We played Goodland when I was in Hays, and I was always impressed. It was too good an opportunity."

He said he is looking forward to working for Activities Director Don Smith, who was his coach and teacher in high school.
