Weather conference to be held in Hays

If you're interested in weather, the High Plains Chapter of the American Meteorological Society and National Weather Association will meet Thursday and Friday, Sept. 4 and 5, at the Hays Holiday Inn.

Forecasters from across the Central Plains will gather to talk about recent severe weather events, local research and the latest forecasting techniques.

"The science of meteorology and the technology we use every day is changing so rapidly," said Dave Floyd, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Goodland. "We need to sit down and take a breath after the Plains severe-weather season winds down and share with each other what we've learned during the past year".

The conference has folks attending from seven states and as far away as Chicago, Floyd said.

"While most of us attending do this for a living, there will be a lot of good information for the everyday weather enthusiast," said Floyd, who encourages anyone with an interest in weather to register and attend.

While many topics relate to severe weather, others include recent major snow events, forecasting strong winds, emerging technology to report severe weather and the impact of forecasts and warnings on society.
