# Kansans donate hours to non-profit

ntbetz@nwkansas.com Kansas Democrats participated in a first for any national party convention by spending a couple of hours helping a non-profit group sort, pack and load surplus medical supplies to be sent to third-world countries.

Gov. Kathleen Sebelius joined a group of delegates from Kansas and North Carolina at the Project C.U.R.E. warehouse in Littleton, Colo. sorting bags of donated medical supplies, packing special boxes to go to a third-world country and to load medical equipment and boxes in a truck to go to Uganda in Africa.

The delegates took the Denver light rail to a station about a mile from the warehouse, and in true "green" effort they walked to the warehouse.

Roberta Boitano, a volunteer who drives down from north Denver two days a week, was on hand to welcome the delegates when they arrived.

She said Project C.U.R.E. receives donated surplus medical supplies from medical manufacturers, hospitals, doctors and private citizens.

Michael Young, director of operations, said the types of supplies include partly used boxes of surgical gloves, sheets, gowns and syringes. He said these supplies are thrown out by hospitals on a regular basis especially in surgical units, but they can be repackaged and sent to the more than 120 countries to help save lives.

Boitano said the warehouse was donated to the group by American Furniture, and has been a great improvement because they aren't

always having to move from place to place.

Gov. Sebelius was part of a group of about 10 delegates who were taking sacks of supplies sent to the warehouse and separating them and putting them in the proper tubs based on identifying what the item was.

Another group of Kansas and North Carolina delegates were picking out items to put in special kit boxes to be sent to towns throughout Iraq

A third group was helping Boitano load a truck with equipment and boxes bound to be packed in a shipping container to be taken to Uganda.

Boitano said the success of the group comes from the fact they only go to countries when they get requests, and they only send what is needed. She said the other thing is to be sure the supplies can be shipped to the country without any duty, and will be allowed to be delivered to the specified destinations.

"We have more than 10,000 volunteers," she said, "and our overhead is only 2 percent."

Young thanked the delegates for coming and said he hoped they would consider starting medical supply collections in their towns when they go home.

"We don't get much from Kansas or North Carolina," he said, "and with your help we might be able to change that and add two more states to our network."

He showed the group a video about how the program works, and places around the world where the medical supplies have helped save Doug Jackson, project director said, lives.

"This is a convention of change," change."
