Donations. tax credits combine to help Tech College upgrade

ntbetz@nwkansas.com Maintaining college buildings and purchasing new technology equipment has been a struggle for all Kansas colleges and universities, and the state legislature passed a tax credit program to help the colleges.

Northwest Kansas Technical College President Ken Clouse and Bill Finley, director of support services and the endowment program talked to the Sherman County Economic Development Council last Tuesday about how the tax credit program can help the Goodland college.

Finley said the tax credit program

to the tech college capital improvement fund for deferred maintenance or for technology equipment will be allowed a 60 percent tax credit on their state income tax.

He said the college has several areas of maintenance work and new technology equipment needed, and that with this program they can get money to help get the needed work done with the help of donations from local people.

Finley said the challenge is to get the word out about the new program, and that the college has not had this opportunity before.

He said the tax credit effort came began in July, and that any Kansas from a demonstration last year by

were bringing awareness to the poor conditions of the university campus buildings.

Jerry Fairbanks, council member from First National Bank, said what makes the program work is the ability to deduct the contribution on the

federal income taxes. Finley said if a person who makes a donation doesn't have a Kansas tax liability the state will write a check to the person at the 60 percent


