She was born on April 19, 1934, to Harold and Vera (Smith) Daise at Kanorado.

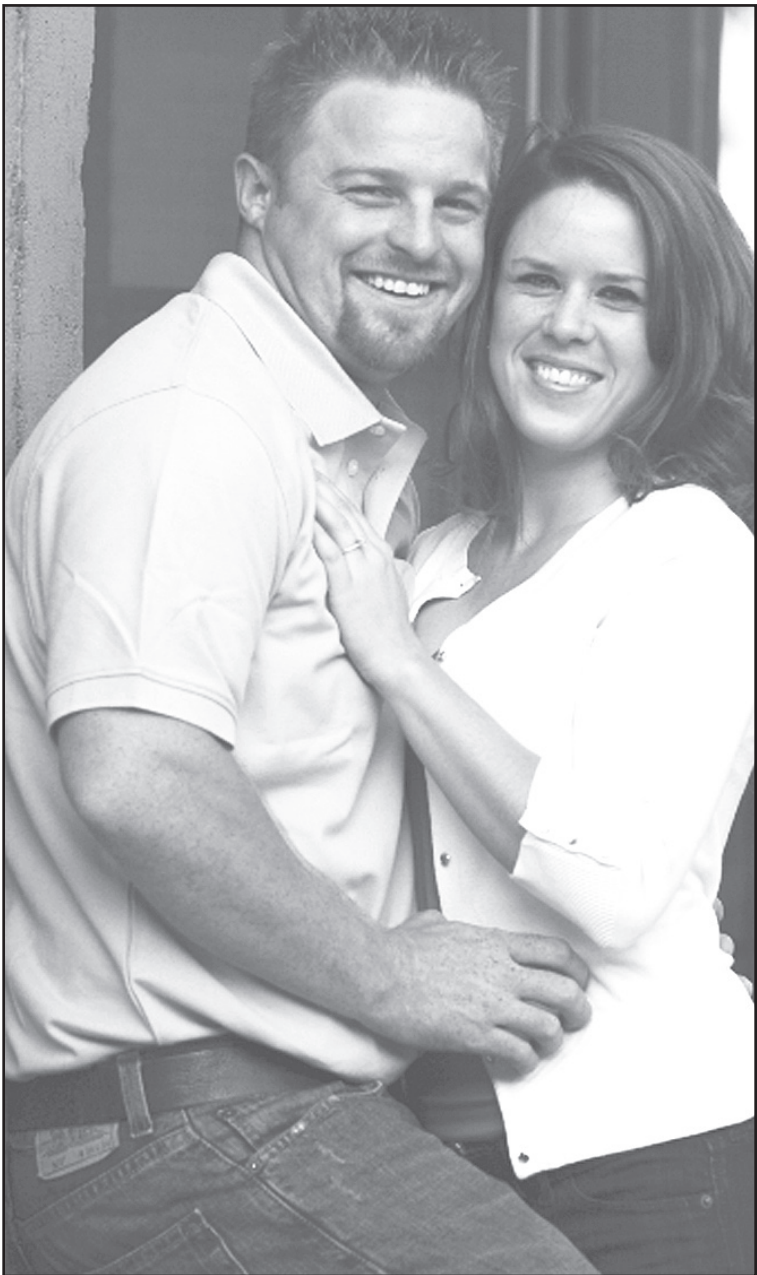
Preceding her in death were her parents and a sister, Marguerite Carpenter.
