Sentencing scheduled in case

Sentencing has been scheduled for 1:30 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 6, for Steve Moyer, who was convicted by a jury in February on charges of criminal sodomy and indecent liberties with a child.

A hearing was held in Sherman County District Court Tuesday morning on a motion filed by Moyer to replace his court-appointed attorney, Jeff Mason, who handled the case through the trial. Judge Scott Showalter listened to Moyer's reasons for replacing Mason, and rebuttal from County Attorney Bonnie Selby representing the state. Showalter said after hearing both arguments he was going to deny the motion, and said he hopes Moyer can work with Mason over the next three weeks to be ready for the sentencing.

Mason filed a motion for a new trial and has filed an amended mo-

tion. Moyer, too, has filed his own motion and an amended motion for a new trial. Judge Showalter said the motions for a new trial will be considered at the time of sentencing.

A jury found Moyer guilty on Feb. 5, of acts of aggravated criminal sodomy on or about Oct. 2, 2008; criminal sodomy on or about Feb. 19, 2009; aggravated indecent liberties with a child on or about Feb. 19, 2009; criminal sodomy on or about March 23, to April 2, 2009; and criminal sodomy on or about April 3, 2009.

The case for the State in February was presented by attorneys Amy Hanley and Christine Ladner of the Attorney General's Office. Selby told Judge Showalter she was standing in for the state attorney's for the hearing, but the two from the Attorney Generals office would be present for the sentencing.

Crop service moves

Larry Keller and Mike Bretz of CropProductionServices of Sigco Sun not only have moved their offices but have an intern, Chris Staub, working with them for the summer.

Bretz said the office serves sunflower growers in Oklahoma, Texas, Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska and Wyoming.

Sigco Sun, he said, handles confectionary sunflower seeds, bags them and loads them into containers that go to the Kansas City rail and then overseas.
