

# Fans treated to great car racing

The 17th Annual Bill Gray Memorial races were held Saturday at Sherman County Speedway, and a good crowd watched some excellent racing and a special demonstration by a locally owned 305 Sprint car.

The 305 Sprint car is owned by Chuck Lutters (55), and he said he was encouraged to bring his car out to give the people a little demonstration of what the sprint cars are all about.

Earlier in the season the 1200 Outlaw Sprint cars were at Sherman County Speedway, and most of those cars are from Colorado, but Lutters said the difference between those and his car is the 305 Sprints have full sized engines while the 1200 Sprint cars run on motorcycle engines.

Lutters said he has some local sponsors including Dinkel Collision Repair and Eklund Insurance. The car is dedicated to Derrick Lutters, Chuck's son, who was killed by a roadside bomb in Iraq.

"I have been running these for a couple of years," he said, "and it is nice to get a few laps on my home track. I would like to see these cars race here. It is a good track for the sprint cars."

The wing on the car was a bit dented and Lutters said he got the car upside down at a recent race in Hays where he got tangled with another car and flipped it over.

Lutters got to take a turn on the track during the hot laps and said he was able to keep his foot on the gas as the car held to the track very well.

Between the heat races and the main events Lutters got another chance to take laps, and said he enjoyed showing off the car.

It took about 15 seconds for each lap Lutters made around the Sherman County Speedway, and he said the car will do about 100 mph or more.

The next races at Sherman County Speedway will be at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 4, with IMCA Modifieds, IMCA Stock, IMCA Hobby Stock, IMCA Sport Mods and Econos.

The 21st Annual Flatlander Fall Classic will be at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 24, and will continue

at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 25. In case of rain the races would be completed on Sunday.

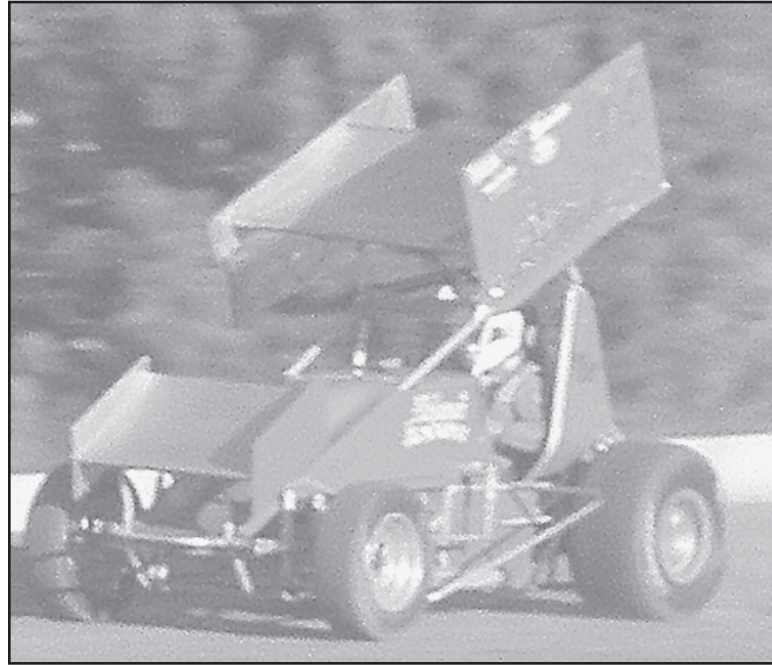
