"I have been running these for a couple of years," he said, "and it is nice to get a few laps on my home track. I would like to see these cars race here. It is a good track for the sprint cars."

The wing on the car was a bit dented and Lutters said he got the car upside down at a recent race in Hays where he got tangled with another car and flipped it over.

Lutters got to take a turn on the track during the hot laps and said he was able to keep his foot on the gas as the car held to the track very

Between the heat races and the main events Lutters got another chance to take laps, and said he enjoyed showing off the car.

It took about 15 seconds for each lap Lutters made around the Sherman County Speedway, and he said the car will do about 100 mph or






