Learn more about stalking; its effects

Sexual and Domestic Violence and 30 sexual and domestic violence advocacy organizations statewide recognize National Stalking Awareness Month in January. Stalking af-The coalition encourages all Kansans to learn more about stalking and to know how to find resources for victims in their community.

"Stalking has a devastating impact on victims and communities, whether the crime is committed by an intimate partner or a stranger," said Joyce Grover, executive director of the coalition. In Kansas, 820 incidences of stalking were reported to law enforcement, and 4,756 protection from stalking orders were filed in Kansas courts in 2009. "We countless others who aren't coming forward. We encourage communities to work together to provide support for victims, to hold offenders accountable and to prevent future tragedies," Grover said.

The Kansas Coalition Against tims. In abusive relationships, stalking is one of the most significant risk factors for femicide (homicide of females). Nationally, in 76 percent of intimate partner femicides, the victims were stalked by their partner fects 3.4 million victims each year, prior to their murder. Eighty-nine including thousands of Kansans. percent of femicide victims had been both physically assaulted and stalked in the 12 months prior to their murder.

Despite these red flags, stalking is often difficult to recognize, investigate and prosecute because unlike other crimes, stalking is a series of acts - a course of conduct that causes fear. Stalking can take many forms. including: following, continuously contacting, abusing pets and vandalizing. The U.S. Department of Justice reports that 46 percent of stalking victims experience at least know that for every victim who one unwanted contact per week, and reports to law enforcement or who three out of four victims are stalked seeks a protection order, there are by someone they know. One in eight employed victims lose time from work, and one in seven victims relocate as a result of being stalked.
