The Cowgirls will continue the home stand tonight at 5:30 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse against another team of Lady Eagles this time from Hugoton. The Hugoton Eagles come in with a 1-5 record, and it is the first Great Western Activity League game for the Cowgirls.

The Cowgirls will play at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday at Max Jones against the Lady Plainsmen of Oakley in a non-league game.

Coach Andy Scheopner was in a pickle early in the first quarter when Cowgirl leading scorer Ashley Archer got into foul trouble with three quick fouls to put her on the bench until late in the game. Archer had 5 points in the game with all coming

"Yeah it was a tough one," Coach Scheopner said. "You can't shoot 17 percent and win many games. I know Hugoton is a very tall team with a 6'3" girl and two 6' girls so that could create some match up problems."

The Cowgirls struggled to get the ball into the basket, and the Lady Eagles press caused some early problems. The scoring was close with Archer hitting two free throws, Jennifer Rome getting a basket on a rebound and Jade Herl hitting a basket with 4 minutes left to give the Cowgirls a 6-4 lead.

Archer was called for three fouls within less than a minute to find herself on the bench with 2:38 left

Colby led 9-8 after the first quarter. Cowgirl M'Lynn Hinger tied the game at 9-9 with a free throw with 6:39 left in the half. She hit another free throw about a minute later to give the Cowgirls a 10-9 lead, and a steal and basket by Herl made it 12-9.

With the three Colby seniors benched Junior Morgan Bell and sophomore sister Lauren stepped up to score more than half of Colby's points with Morgan hitting a team high 17 and Lauren in double figures with 12. Morgan had two free throws and Lauren hit a basket to give the lead back to Colby 13-12.

Colby was leading 15-12 with about a minute left, but Herl tied the score at 15-15 with a 3-point basket. Lauren Bell had two more free throws with 24 seconds left to give Colby an 18-15 lead. Herl got tied up under the Colby basket and called time with 8.4 seconds left, but the Cowgirls were unable to score before the buzzer.

In the third quarter Colby got the ball and Morgan Bell hit a one of her three 3-point shots and hit another field goal to give Colby a 23-15 lead with six minutes left in the quarter.

The Cowgirls did not score until Rome hit with 3:24 left.

Again Morgan Bell hit one of her 3-point shots to make it 28-17 and Cowgirl Paige Phillips got a basket to make it 28-19 with 2 minutes left. Colby got one more basket to make it 30-19 after three quarters.


