

Cowgirls bounce back to defeat Lady Eagles

Play was different for the Cowgirls on Friday night as they bounced back from the loss on Tuesday to win 44-25 over the Hugoton Lady Eagles at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The win gives the Cowgirls a 4-2 record with 2-1 in league play and 3-1 at home with one win on the road and one loss at a neutral site.

The home stand continues tonight at 5:30 p.m. when the Lady Plainsmen of Oakley come to Max Jones Fieldhouse for a non-league game. The Lady Plainsmen are 6-1 on the season and have a 4-0 record on the road.

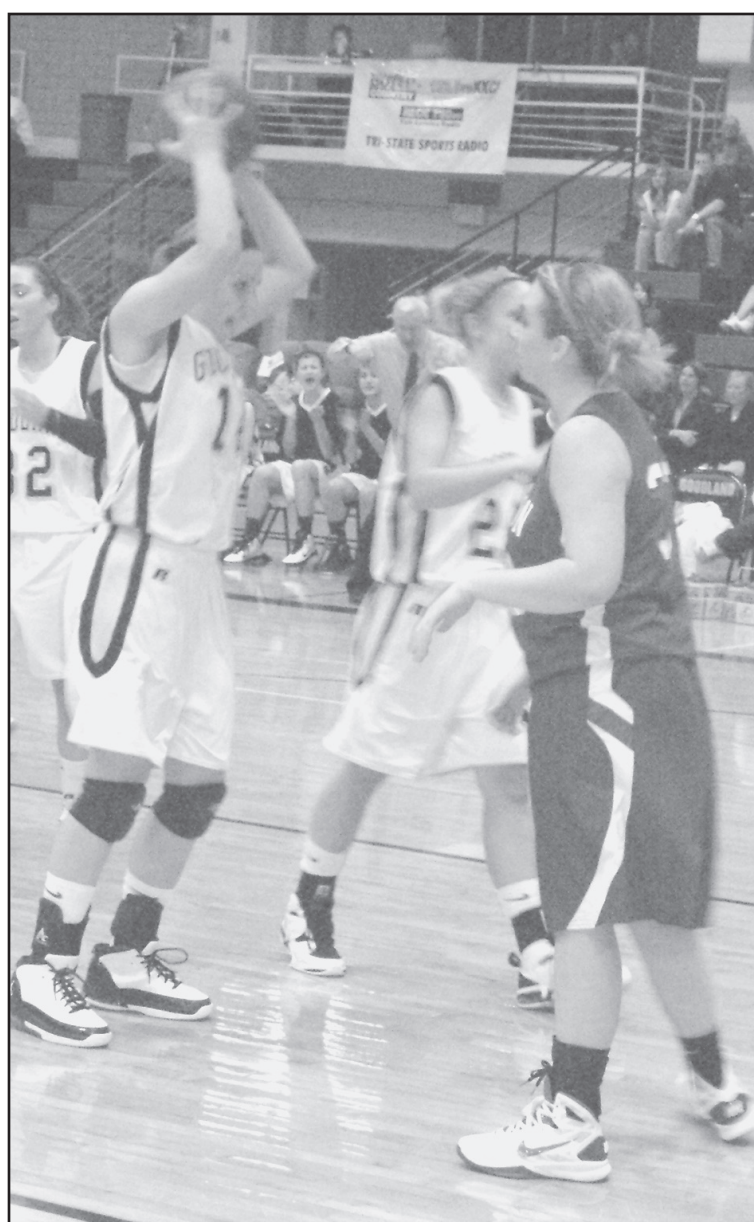
Friday the Cowgirls got the scoring going early to lead 10-4 after the first quarter, and had extended the lead to 20-9 by halftime. In the third quarter the Cowgirls extended the lead to 34-13. In the final quarter the Lady Eagles were able to get some baskets to close the gap with Goodland winning 44-25.

Coach Andy Scheopner said he felt the Cowgirls played a lot more consistently than they had on Tuesday.

"We had several other girls step up and score points for us," he said, "and that will be important as the year goes on."

The Cowgirls got off to an early start on a basket by Ashley Archer and one by Jennifer Rome. Archer got another basket and Jade Herl got a steal and a layup to make it 8-4 with 3:22 left. Archer got another basket with less than two minutes left to give her 6 points, which was more than she had in the Colby game on Tuesday, and she did not get into foul trouble.

The Lady Eagles had ball handling trouble and were called for traveling frequently as they tried to score. Eagles BayLee Hoskinson and Chastity Parsons both 5'3" sophomores had fast hands

and caused some problems for the Cowgirls.

Rome hit a 3-point shot with 1 minute left in the half to make it a nine point lead 18-9. At the buzzer Archer was fouled when she was shooting. Archer hit both free throws to make it 20-9 at half.

In the third quarter Paige Phillips hit a 3-point basket, Archer hit a

basket and Rome hit another 3-point basket to make it 28-11. With under 3 minutes left Archer had a chance at a 3-point play when she hit a basket and was fouled. Archer did not make the free throw to make it 34-13, and that was the score at the buzzer.

Archer hit in the first minute of the fourth quarter to make it 36-15. Brianna White hit three baskets in

the final minutes to make it 42-25. Herl hit two free throws with less than 20 seconds to make the final score 44-25.

Archer led the Cowgirls scoring with 15 points, Rome was in double figures with 10, Brianna White 6, Paige Phillips and Herl 5 each, M'Lynn Hinger 2 and Hope Cochran 1.

The Cowgirls hit 32.5 percent (14-43) for field goals, 37.5 percent (3-8) from 3-point range and 36.8 percent (9-18) free throws. Goodland had 26 rebounds and Archer led the team with 11. The Cowgirls had 11 steals and made 11 turnovers.

The Lady Eagles hit 34.4 percent from the floor (11-32), hit none of the four 3-point shots and hit 42.9

percent (3-7) free throws. The Eagles had 14 rebounds and 19 turnovers.

Friday the Cowgirls will be in action at 5:30 p.m. on the road for a Great Western Activity Conference game at Holcomb. The Cowgirls will be back at Max Jones for a rematch with Holcomb on Friday, Jan. 28.
