City Manager Doug Gerber said he thought the water improvement project was doing well and said engineer Darin Neufeld from Evans, Bierly, Hutchison and Associates, was present if the commissioners had any questions.

Neufeld said the water tank crew was in town last week and will be coming back to check the tanks for leaks.

Rich Simon, public works director, said the main line is installed all across town on 10th Street. He said there are four tie- ins to do yet, and the city can't do those until they are ready to abandon the old lines. He power in next week, and that was not a city electrical problem.

As part of the consent agenda the commissioners approved a change order on the water line section of the project with Van Kirk Brothers of Sutton, Neb. The change order decreases the cost of the water line portion of the project by \$56,477 to \$2,428,089.

Gerber said the reduction in cost was because the water lines to the waste water ponds did not have to be put in out to the industrial park, and that saved about \$56,000.
