## George Neal "Tom" Stewart

George Neal "Tom" Stewart, 93, retired Wallace County rancher, died Sunday, Jan. 30, 2011, at Greeley County Hospital at Tribune.

He was born on July 13, 1917, to Harvey Almond and Sarah (Pack) Stewart at home on the family farm south of Weskan. He was the 10th of 11 children. At the age of two, he lost his right eye in an accident.

Mr. Stewart served for many years on the Wallace County Fair Board and with E.A. See and Junior Kreigh started the home owned carnival.

Preceding him in death were his wife; his parents; an infant daughter, Connie May Stewart; his brothers and sisters, Earnest, Julia, Marybelle, Jean, Harry, Grant, Bill. Jessie, Hazel and Edna.
