

## Primary election for City Commissioners Tuesday

 Tuesday the City of Goodland citizens will be able to vote in a Primary Election at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall to reduce the number of commission candidates from seven to six.  
 Advance voting for the city primary is open, and will continue through noon on Monday, at the Sherman County Clerk's office.  
 Under city ordinance the city has

to have a primary when the number of candidates exceeds twice the number of commissioner seats up for election and the city has three seats up for election this year.  
 As of the filing deadline seven people filed for the three city commission positions up for election on April 5.  
 Those filing include incumbents Dave Daniels and Annette Fairbanks. The other five include Chris Zimmerman, Gary Farris, Bill Fin-

ley, Jeff Deeds and Randy Topliff.  
 City citizens will vote for three on the primary election ballot and the top six candidates will move ahead to the April 5 General Election.  
 County Clerk Janet Rumpel said the primary election on Tuesday will be held at the Veterans of Foreign Wars hall, and voters who live in the city will be eligible to vote.  
 When the General Election is held voters from Kanorado, Goodland, the Goodland School District and

Brewster School District residents of Sherman County will be eligible to vote.  
 The Goodland School Board has four positions up for election in April and six people filed for the seats.  
 Those filing are Incumbent board member Chuck Wilkens, and the five others include Mike Brannick, Teresa Sieck, Jessica Cole, Gennifer House and Diane Stiles.  
 School board incumbent mem-

bers Jane Philbrick and John Hendrich did not file for re-election.  
 Positions open in Kanorado are for Mayor and City Council. Kanorado City Clerk Deb Fahey said current Mayor Dennis Korbolik filed and Allan Billenwillms filed for city council.  
 She said the city council has two seats up for election. Kanorado will have an open council seat, Fahey said, and unless there is a write-in the council will have to appoint a

person to fill the second vacancy.  
 The General Election on Tuesday, April 5, will include the Goodland School District request for a bond issue for \$14.9 million to renovate North school into a K-6 facility and remodel the Goodland High school to be a 7-12 facility.  
 The School District Board has scheduled a public meeting on the building issue for 7 p.m. on Monday, at the high school auditorium.
