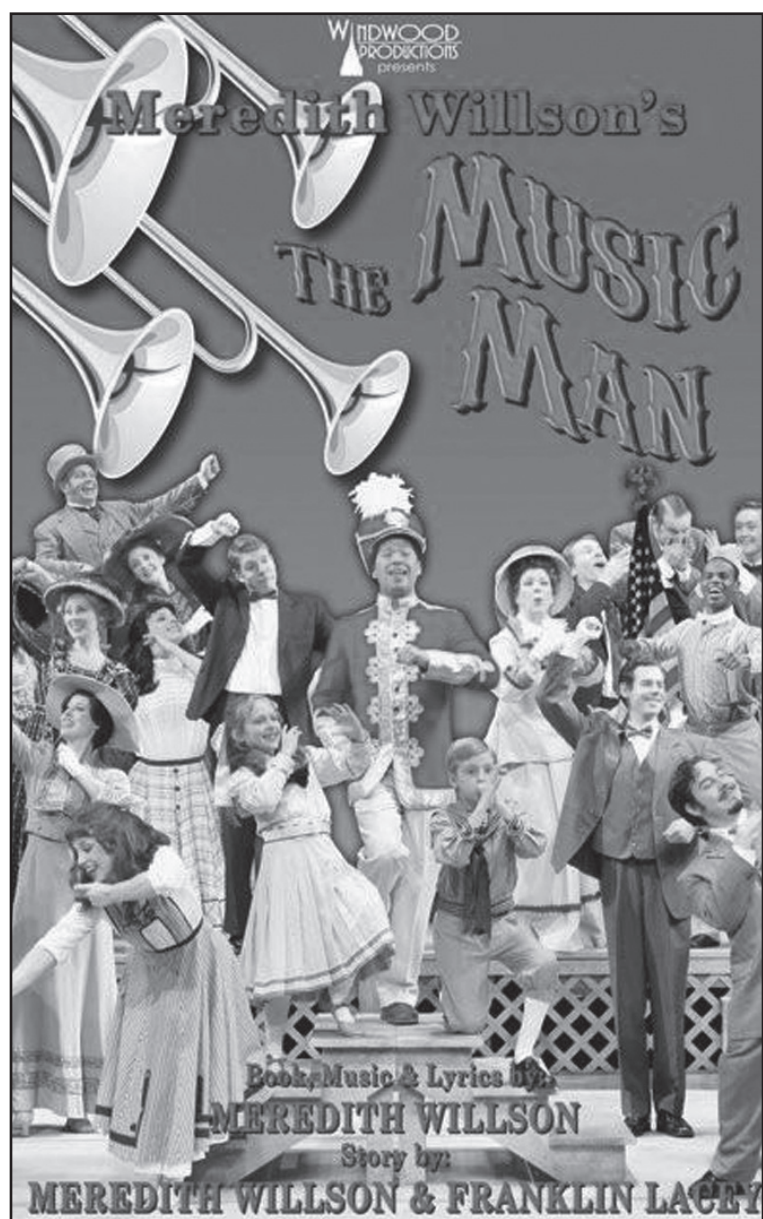
New daughter joins Goodland couple
