Former resident Charlotte Hinger will be at two book signings. The Carnegie Arts Center signing will be from 1 to 4 p.m. on Sunday and the Goodland Library's book signing will be at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday. A dessert bar will be served at the library and the Goodland Book Bags Book Club is the host.

She is signing "Lethal Lineage." This is the second book in the Lotie Albright series. The first book of the series received a starred review from "Kirkus Reviews" and won the AZ Book Publishers award for Best Mystery/Suspense.

Hinger now lives in Loveland, Colo., where she moved to from Hoxie after the death of her husband, Don.

She earned a Master of Arts in history from Fort Hays State University. Hinger is working on a book about 19th Century Kansas African American politicians for the University of Oklahoma Press.

Her "Kansas History" article, "The Colored People Hold the Key": Abram Thompson Hall, Jr.'s Campaign to Organize Graham County" won the Westerners International Award for Best Article. An article on African Americans and the Harlem Renaissance in the West will appear in an anthology published by Routledge. Her historical novel, "Come Spring," (Simon and Schuster) won the Western Writers of America Medicine Pipe Bearer's award. Hinger was the editor of two comprehensive hardcover volumes of family and county narratives, "Sheridan County, Kansas; A History of Faith and Labor."

Hinger has served on the board of the Kansas State Historical Society and on the editorial board of "Heritage of the Great Plains." She has also published mystery short stories and historical articles on the American West.
