Houseplants have growth spurt at start of spring

As outdoor plants break dormancy and start to grow in response to the longer days and warmer spring temperatures, houseplants usually put on a spurt of growth as well.

Eventually, these indoor plants outgrow their containers and need to be repotted. To check if your plants are becoming root bound and need a larger pot, inspect the root system. First, knock the plant out of its pot. Watering several hours before this operation will allow the plant to be removed more easily.

On pots that are 8 inches in diameter or less, place one hand over the top of the pot with the stem of the plant passing between two fingers,

and turn the plant upside down. Then rap the edge of the pot against a table. The root ball should come away from the pot.

On pots that are more than 8 inches in diameter, a bit more encouragement may be needed. Place the pot on its side and rap the top edge of the pot with a rubber mallet. Turn the plant a few degrees, and repeat the
