Talking about the advisory committee Lampe said he is looking for outside people who can help grow the connection with the college and the community.

"Six heads are better than me," he said. "The outside people know how to make the connections in the community.

"We are not here to make money, but we are here to advance the college and if that happens the community and economy advance. We don't just want to survive, we want to excell. We want to be a program the community is proud of, and want to be a winner and people like to associate with a winner.'

He said he wants help getting input into what the college is doing, and help look at how to make that connection.
