Preceding him in death were his wife in 1999 and a son, Gary Eugene

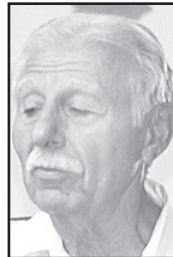
in infancy in 1945. Survivors include two sons Ricky Bouziden and Victor Bouziden of the home; two brothers, Thomas
