Six Goodland wrestlers earn medals at state tournament

Six Goodland wrestlers won medals at the state Kids Wrestling tournament Saturday and Sunday in Topeka.

All but one age bracket had a medalist, with two in the 12 and under division.

Goodland had three third-place finishers, one fifth, and two sixth placers.

Twenty-three wrestlers made the trip to the Kansas Expo Center in Topeka.

Coach Terry Bahe said that only Colby qualified more kids from the state meet.

"I think that's darn good," Bahe said.

Bahe added that he was particularly happy with the way that the

new kids had wrestled.

"We had a lot of kids that had never wrestled before do very well," Bahe said.

At state, the top six in each age and weight division received medals. To get to the state tourney, each wrestler had to have placed fourth or better last month at the sub-district tournament in Colby, and then at the district tournament in Great Bend.

Jayhawk bench has Williams concerned

LAWRENCE—Kansas reserve Michael Lee tried telling teammate and close friend Aaron Miles about his frustration with criticism directed at the Kansas bench.

All Miles could do was laugh.

"It wasn't funny, but it was funny to me," said Miles, the team's starting point guard. "I knew how good he was, even if he said he wasn't. It made me angry when anyone else said anything bad about him."

Lee and several other reserves have played well recently, giving people little to say.

However, as Kansas prepares to make its second straight Final Four appearance Saturday against Marquette, Jayhawk coach Roy Williams believes the bench is a concern.

"I would say it's the biggest difference between this year's team and last year's," Williams said.

There have been signs of progress, though.

"Michael Lee — knock on wood — has really played well," Williams said. "He was awful against Missouri in the semifinals of the conference tournament, but if you knock that moment out, he's played pretty doggone good for the last month."

Sophomore small forward Bryant Nash averages three points a game — also progress, considering he failed to score in seven of Kansas' first 11 games.

"Last year it was a much stronger bench," Lee said, "but this year we are a lot tougher."

Outlaws win two at Hugoton

The Goodland Outlaw baseball team opened its season with a double-header sweep Monday in Hugoton, beating the Eagles 4-0 in six innings and 9-2 in four innings. Both games went the 1 1/2-hour time limit before being called.

The Outlaws are in independent team of high-school baseball players barnstorming around the western half of the state, playing games against junior varsity teams that can fit them into their schedules.

Manager Liz West had several

games scheduled with teams in eastern Colorado, but all of those had to be canceled because Colorado rules ban play against non-sanctioned teams.

In Hugoton, the Outlaws scored twice in the first inning and twice in the third, as Landon West pitched six innings of shut-out ball capped off by the last play of the game, when left fielder Tyrel Rall caught a fly-ball and threw it back all the way to catcher Derek Fenner. Fenner, guarding home plate, got knocked down by the Hugoton runner, who had tagged at third. Fenner

held on to the ball, and the Outlaws had their first win of the season.

Brock Lohr was the winning pitcher in game two, giving up one hit in four innings. The Outlaws had a big third, scoring six runs on five hits. Lohr struck out four Hugoton batters, and West threw out an Eagle who was trying to steal second in the second inning.

"The boys played well," said Coach Bud. "I was pleased. We know what we have to work on."

The Outlaws' next game is scheduled for 3 p.m. Thursday in Goodland against Garden City.
