

Cowboys win Lamar track meet, Cowgirls fifth

The Goodland Cowboys Track team made their first trip to Lamar, Colo., a memorable one. The Cowboys took home the gold medal as a team. The Cowgirls did well, taking fifth place.

Head Coach Kent Teeter was without some of his top athletes due to the spring break. He said he was pleased with the trip to Lamar, and felt it was a good tournament and the people did a great job.

Lamar led the field of 22 teams with 102 points about 25 points ahead of Lamar in second. Walsh, Colo., was third at 66, Springfield, Colo., fourth 65, Florence, Colo., fifth 48, Peyton, Colo., sixth 43, Limon, Colo., seventh 37, La Junta, Colo., eighth 33.

Other teams in order included Fowler 26, Eads 21, Swink 19, Wiley 19, South Baca 16, Calhan 16, Pikes Peak Christian 13, McClave 13, Holly 10, Chreaw 9, Kiowa 8, Pueblo South 7, Lama JV 7 and Rock Ford 7.

Cowboys had first place finishes in the 4x100 Relay with a time of 49.49 seconds and the team was Reed Bellamy, Chris Bustillos, Riley Oharah and Garth Helton. Bustillos was first in the 400 meter dash with a time of 54.49.

Brock Wilkens took first in the high jump with 6 feet 2 inches, and Kelly Pearson was second with a jump of 6'.

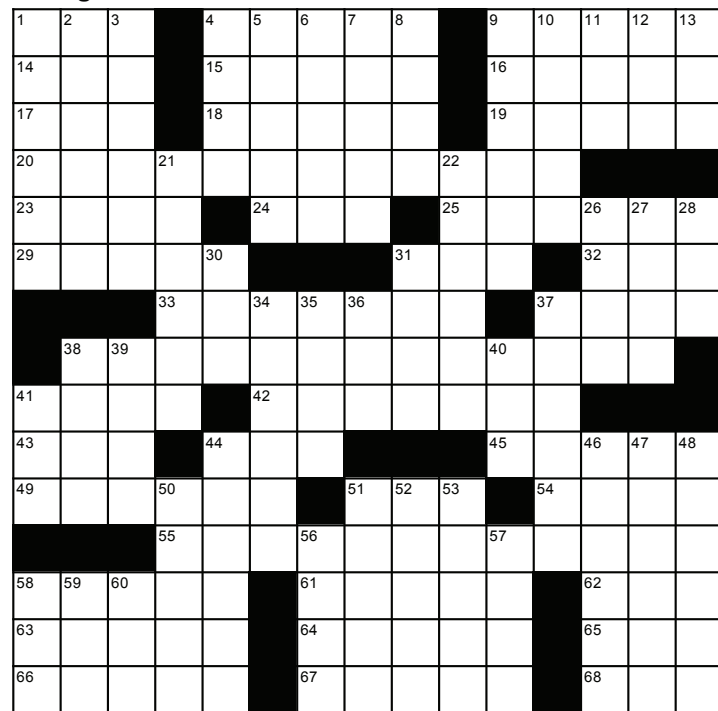
