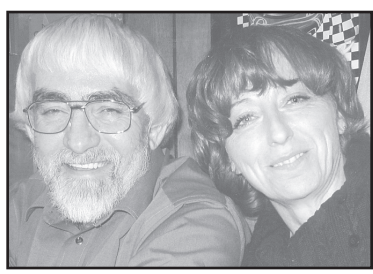

Jack Lowell Rieb, 87, St. Francis businessman, died Thursday, April 7, 2011, in the Cheyenne County Hospital after a brief illness

He was born on Aug. 16, 1923, to Dorothy and Rudy Rieb at St. Francis. Mr. Rieb completed his elementary and high school education in St. Francis and after graduating he attended Kansas State University at Manhattan majoring in mechanical engineering. While at K-State he was a member of the Delta Tau Delta fraternity.

Following his sophomore year at K-State he served in the U.S. Army starting the spring of 1943. After basic training and combat engineering training he shipped out for England in November 1944. His troop ship was passing through the Panama Canal when the atomic bomb exploded over Hiroshima. After serving in the occupation force in Japan he returned to the U.S. and was honorably discharge on Feb. 23, 1946, at Fort Logan, Colo.

He met his future wife, Beatrice Tuggle of Clay Center, in the spring of 1947 at K-State.

Mr. Rieb graduated from K-State in the spring of 1947 and returned to St. Francis to team up with his father at Rieb Motor Company, the local dealership for Minneapolis Moline farm machinery and Chrysler and Plymouth automobiles.

In Aug. 1948, Beatrice graduated from K-State with a major in home economics. On Oct. 1, 1948, they were married at the First Methodist

Church in Clay Center. After honeymooning in New Orleans, they settled in St. Francis.

Mr. Rieb remained at Rieb Motor Company until 1966 when he opened the Rieb Skogomo dry goods store. With his wife they managed that business until 1990 when he sold the store and retired. After retirement the couple traveled, attended local and regional cultural events, visiting friends and family.

The couple were active members of the United Methodist Church and played in the Truly Amazing Bells bell choir.

He served a term on the St. Francis City Council and was a member of the Lions Club, the St. Francis Masonic Lodge and the Cheyenne County Shrine Club.

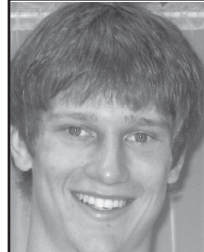
