

# Cowboys win home course golf tournament

The Cowboys Golf team won their second tournament of the season winning the Goodland tournament held Tuesday at Sugar Hills Golf Club.

Five Cowboys placed in the top 10 with two tying and winning playoffs. Cowboy Tanner Jones finished second with a round of 74, one stroke behind the winner Kade Brown of Oberlin with a 73.

Cowboys George Bellani and Gage Ihrig tied for third at 75, and Bellani won the playoff to take third and Gage Ihrig was fourth.

Cowboys Tyler Jones and Gannon Ihrig were in a three-way tie at 78 for sixth with Brady Buxman of Ulysses. Jones won the playoff for sixth, Buxman was sixth and Gannon Ihrig was eighth.

Fifth was Anthony Delcorral of Ulysses 77; ninth was Paul Schiferl of Colby 80 who won a playoff with Marcus Portschy of Rawlins County 80, who finished 10th.

Cowboy Joel Linin finished 13th with 81. In the Cowboys (II) Cy Paxton had an 85.

"It took a pretty low score to medal," said Cowboy Coach Terry Daise. "Conditions were excellent to play in. We performed at a very high level again this week, placing five of our players in the top 10."

Goodland won the tournament with a low score of 302; second, Ulysses 325; third Thomas More Prep of Hays 334; fourth Colby 347; fifth Oakley 356; sixth Oberlin 374; seventh Hoxie 376; eighth Norton 379; ninth Hays JV 381; 10th Rawlins County 384; 11th Scott City 385; 12th Hugoton

## Cowgirls softball team loses two games

The Goodland Cowgirl softball team lost their first games Tuesday afternoon against the Garden City Buffaloes, 10-9 and 15-5. Their record is 6-2.

The team will play today at 3 p.m. at Ulysses.

In the first inning of the first game the first batter Hope Cochran was out when her fly ball was caught by the catcher. Berkley White struck out and pitcher Ashley Archer was out when her fly ball was caught by the Garden City right fielder. The first two batters for Garden city when their fly balls were caught by Gabby Rangel at short stop and Kirsten Topliff the center fielder. The third batter walked and was batted in for the only run of Garden City. The score Garden City, 1-0.

In the second inning the Cowgirls had three and three out. Garden City added one more run.

For the second game the Cowgirls didn't start scoring until the third inning when Cochran, Berkley White Archer, Brianna White Miranda Hernandez, and Rangel scored six runs. In the fourth inning Cochran added a run from a double, Berkley White a run and Archer a run from a triple with two runs batted in. Brianna White earned a run batted in. Berkley White added another score from a single with two stolen bases

in the sixth inning. Katlyn Topliff added a run from a single in the seventh inning.

Goodland won 11-10. Archer pitched the first game and Cochran the second.

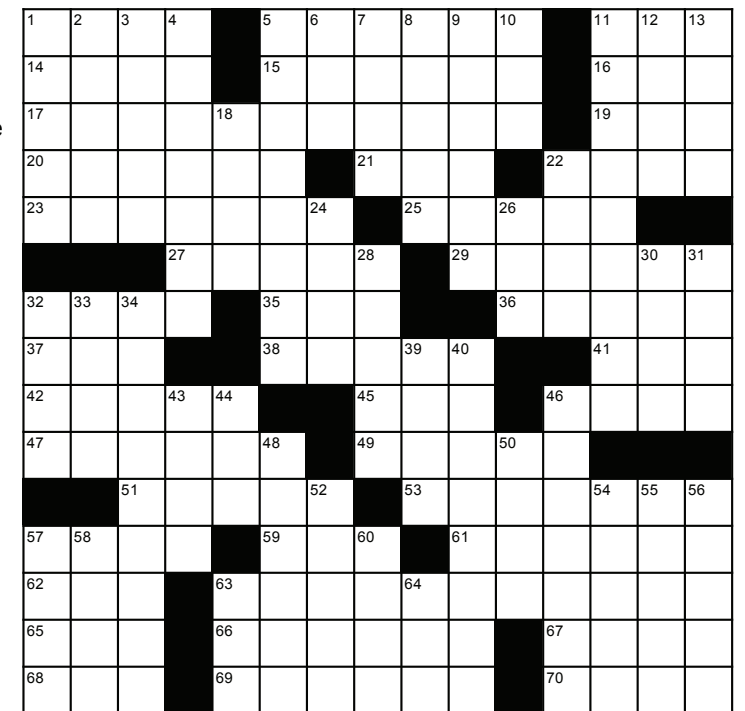
