

# Cowboy golfers win at Colby, Ulysses

Another Cowboy stepped up at the Colby golf tournament on Friday as the Cowboys won the tournament and all of the Cowboys medaled for the second time this season.

The Cowboys won again on Saturday at Ulysses with three Cowboys medaling.

Goodland won at Colby with a team score of 314. Colby was second 342, Oakley third 355, Oberlin fourth 367, Norton fifth 368, Atwood sixth 380, Hoxie seventh 392, Colby junior varsity eighth, and Scott City ninth 412.

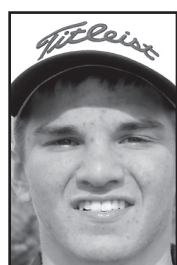
Cowboy Gage Ihrig led the field of 55 golfers with a score of 74, to over the par 72 for the golf course.

Ihrig beat fellow Cowboy George Bellani who was second by one stroke at 75. Bellani had been the winner in two previous tournaments at Atwood and Thomas More Prep in Hays.

"For the second time this year, all of our golfers medaled," said Coach Terry Daise. "This doesn't happen very often. These guys have worked hard in practice and on their own to achieve the excellent results we have had so far this year."

Cowboy Joel Linin was fourth at

80, and Tyler Jones, Gannon Ihrig and Tanner Jones rounded out the top 10 tying for eighth to 10th with scores of 85.

The Cowboys won on Saturday at Ulysses with a team score of 317. Ulysses was second 326, Liberal third 331, Garden City fourth 37, Meade fifth 347, Colby sixth 353, Larned seventh 355, Lakin eighth 356, Hugoton ninth 383 and Scott City 10th 394.

Cowboy Bellani finished second in the tournament with a three over par 75. Gage Ihrig tied with a 75 and finished third. Brady Buxman of Ulysses won with a 73.

"The weather was excellent for playing on Saturday," Daise said. "George and Gage both had good rounds, especially being the first time playing the course."

Cowboy Gannon Ihrig was eighth with an 82. Tanner Jones had an 85, Linin 87, and Tyler Jones 92.

Cowboy junior varsity will be in Brewster today at 1 p.m.

The Great Western Activity Conference league golf tournament will be held at 2 p.m. on Thursday at Sugar Hills Golf Club.

# Baseball team splits games in Hays, last games today

The Cowboys won two and lost two at the Western Diamond Classic held in Hays Thursday, Friday and Saturday moving their season record to 11-7.

The Cowboys play Ulysses today at Memorial Field for the final home games of the season and Coach Mull said the league title is in the balance. The Cowboys played Ellis on Friday at Hays winning 12-2 in five innings, but lost to Salina Central 12-1 in five innings in the afternoon.

On Saturday the Cowboys defeated Colby 9-8 in the morning, but lost to Hays 11-1 in the afternoon.

Coach Devlin Mull said the Cowboys were down 8-3 to Colby in the bottom of the seventh inning and scored six runs to win 9-8. He said it was a fun way to finish the game.

Regional baseball games will be next week and Coach Mull said the Cowboys will play Lyons on Monday at Thomas More Prep in Hays. He said the Cowboys go in as the fourth seed, and if they win on Monday will face the top seed Lakin on Wednesday in Hays.
