Mark Joseph Heckman

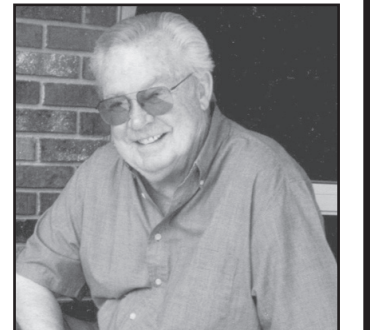
