

Cowboys beat Lyons, lose to Lakin in regionals

nt.betz@nwkansas.com The Cowboys baseball season came to an end in Hays on Wednesday losing to the No. 1 seed Lakin, 6-5 in the semi-final game of the Class 3A regional tournament.

The Cowboys had come from behind in the bottom of the seventh inning on Monday to defeat Lyons-Chase 6-5 to win the opening round of the tournament on a two-run single by Cowboy Taylen Smith.

Cowboy Austin Avelar was the starting pitcher on Monday.

Wednesday Lakin took an early 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first. Cowboy Garth Helton was having trouble pitching in the early part of the inning walking the first three batters. Lakin scored on a sacrifice fly, and Helton struck out the final batter to get out with only giving up one run.

Helton pitched five innings giving up five runs on 5 hits, gave up 7 walks and struck out 2.

The Cowboys took a 2-1 lead in the top of the second inning, but Lakin came back in the bottom to tie it at 2-2. Lakin took a 4-2 lead in the bottom of the fourth.

The Cowboys came back in the top of the fifth to score three runs and take a 5-4 lead. Lakin changed pitchers after walking in a run with the bases loaded. Smith hit a single up the middle to score two Cowboys more fun next year. and give Goodland the lead.

In the bottom of the fifth Lakin loaded the bases, but somehow Helton and the Cowboys escaped only giving up one run to tie the

score 5-5. Cowboy Michael Pettibone came in to pitch in the sixth inning. Neither team scored in the sixth bringing it all down to the seventh. The Cowboys got two runners into score position, but were not able to get

one home. In the bottom of the seventh the Cowboys had two throwing errors giving Lakin the opportunity to score and win the game 6-5.

The Cowboys finish with a 14-8 record and were the Great Western Activity Conference champions. The 14-8 record is the best for the Cowboy program since it started.

Coach Devlin Mull said he was proud of the Cowboys despite the loss to Lakin. Lakin went on to lose to Thomas


