In the girls 12 to 13 group Logan Perryman was first with 51, Katie Hays second with 65, and Sarah Johnson third with 96.

In the girls 14 to 15 group Emily Purvis was first with 145, and Miranda Hernandez second at 156.

The Junior Golf program is sponsored through Sugar Hills Golf Course and the golfers meet at the course for practice, and the coaches help the young golfers learn the basics of the game. The junior golfers will have a home tournament later in the summer.

# Goodland swim team takes third at Holyoke, sets pool record

Thirty-one Goodland Swim Team members traveled to Holyoke, Colo., on Saturday to compete in the first Northwest Kansas Swim League meet. Goodland came away with one pool record, six individual gold medals and a third place finish with 197 points behind Wray, Colo. with 223 points, and Colby with 201 points.

The team will travel to Wray, Colo., Saturday for their second meet.

Dusty Johnson (11-12 boys) won the 50-yard backstroke and set a new pool record at 36.85. He also came in first in the 50-yard breaststroke (43.14) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (1:21.89).

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) was a winner in all three of her races, 100-yard freestyle (1:03.58), 50-yard freestyle (27.46) and 100-yard butterfly (1:11.24).

Devinee Borgmann (11-12 girls) placed first in the 50-yard backstroke (39.81) and was second in the 50-yard freestyle (31.78) and 50-yard butterfly (35.78).

In 8 and under girls Sydney Hahn was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (1:10.62) and fifth in the 25-yard backstroke (29.40) and Olivia Bassett was sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (1:44.35).

The 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle relay was third (2:49.37) with Olivia Bassett, Vivian Solomon, Athena Armstrong and Annika Linin swimming.

In 8 and under boys Jared Stoffel was second in the 50-yard freestyle (48.14), second in the 25-yard freestyle (21.09) and second in the 25-yard breaststroke (27.07) and Ethan McDaniels was third in the 50-yard freestyle (49.62), third in the 25-yard freestyle (21.49) and second in the 25-yard backstroke (24.90).

In 9-10 girls Rachel Witman was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:33.72), fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (17.53) and fourth in the

25-yard backstroke (21.24); Peri Sieck was fifth in the 25-yard freestyle (18.24) and sixth in the 25-yard butterfly (24.12); Rebecca Lockhart was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (2:02.20).

The 9-10 girls 100-yard medley relay was fourth (2:09.59) with Rebecca Lockhart, Rachel Witman, Peri Sieck and Olivia Bassett swimming.

In 9-10 boys Austin Hahn was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:30.31) and fourth in the 25-yard breaststroke (25.77) and Ryan Volk was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:32.24).

The 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle relay was second (1:25.69) with Austin Hahn, Ethan McDaniel, Ryan Volk and Jared Stoffel swimming.

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley relay was fourth (1:52.22) with Sydney Hahn, Jared Stoffel, Ryan Volk and Austin Hahn swimming.

In 11-12 girls Chalee Luther was sixth in 50-yard backstroke (44.66) and Kinsey Volk was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:28.08).

In 11-12 boys Hagan Hoss was second in 50-yard freestyle (32.48), third in 50-yard backstroke (42.45) and second in the 50-yard butterfly (39.77); Simon Bassett was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:24.78), sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (36.46) and third in the 50-yard breaststroke (48.08); Peyton Sieck was fourth

The 13-14 girls 200-yard freestyle relay team was second (2:38.77) with Savannah Bassett, Barriclow, Lindsey Geeska and Kennedy swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-yard medley relay was second (3:08.45) with Barriclow, Kennedy, Savannah Bassett and Geeska swimming.

In 13-14 boys Aaron Avelar was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (33.34) and third in the 100-yard backstroke (1:41.80).

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay was third (2:28.24) with Mikayla Stoffel, Kinsey Volk, Chalee Luther and Avelar swimming.

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard medley relay was third (2:55.86) with Kinsey Volk, Mikayla Stoffel, Avelar and Chalee Luther swimming.

In 15-18 girls Brooke Lockhart was fourth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:29.94).

In 15-18 boys Holton Witman was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:02.64), second in the 50-yard freestyle (26.79) and second in the

100-yard backstroke (1:25.81) and Zach Miller was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:07.81), third in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:21.74) and third in the 200-yard individual medley (2:59.22).

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay team was third (2:01.90) with Bedore, Brooke Lockhart, Zach Miller and Holton Witman swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley relay was second (2:18.07) was second with Bedore, Zach Miller, Holton Witman and Brooke Lockhart swimming.

The Holyoke Swim Club and Oberlin Swim Club were fourth with 173 points. Burlington Swim Team was sixth with 136 points, Oakley was seventh with 41 and Flagler Swim Club was eighth with 13.

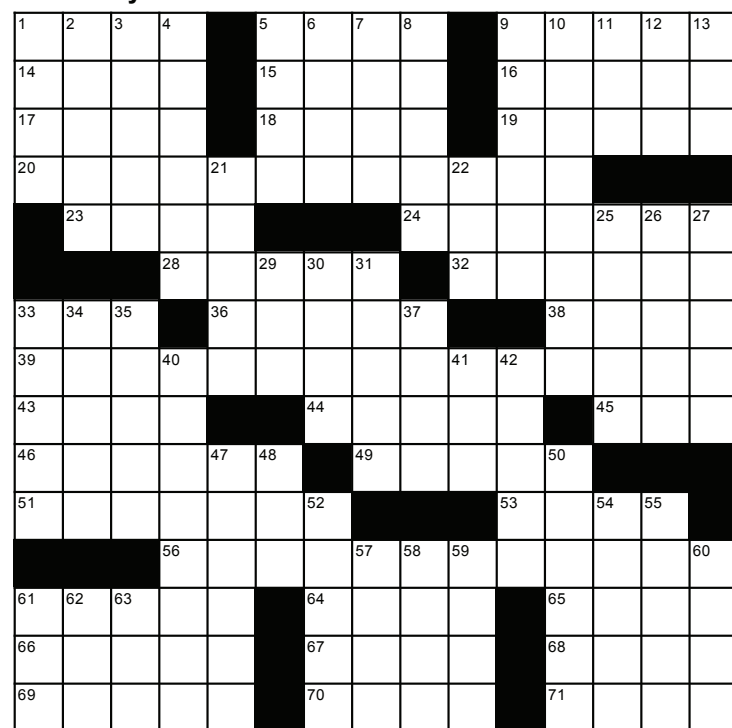

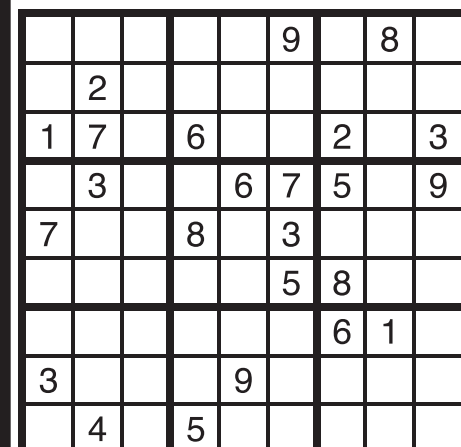
