Garden City wins 13th Levi Hayden tournament on three team tiebreaker

Three teams tied in the 13th Annual Levi Hayden Memorial Tournament with 3-1 records and Garden City was declared the winner based on a tie-breaker on Sunday.

Garden City, Burlington and Lakin all tied with 3-1 records and the championship was determined by the total runs scored by each team with Garden City winning.

James Beasley first baseman for Garden City was voted the most inspirational player by the coaches, umpires and the announcers.

The Levi Hayden Goodland Memorial Scholarship was presented to Garth Helton before the first Goodland Outlaw game on Saturday.

Goodland went 1-3 for the tournament losing to Lakin in the first

game on Saturday, coming back to beat WaKeeney 10-2. On Sunday Goodland lost to Burlington 12-5 and lost to Garden City 12-2.

In the first game on Saturday the Outlaws fell behind to Lakin 10-0 in the first three innings and the game was almost over in the fourth. But with two outs Zack Crow got on base and then stole second and stole third to be in position to score. A passed ball brought Crow in to score for Goodland and keep the game going.

In the fifth inning the Cowboys made an attempt at a comeback getting four runs to narrow the score to 10-5.

A short rain storm on Saturday delayed the games for about 90

minutes, and in the last game of the night the Outlaws took an early lead 2-1 in the first inning against WaKeeney. Goodland added 3 runs in the second inning and four in the fourth to lead 9-2. Goodland added a final run in the fifth to win 10-2.

On Sunday the Outlaws had a 2-0 lead over Burlington in the first inning and held onto a 2-1 lead in the second. Things fell apart a bit in the third inning at Goodland gave up 5 runs to Burlington to fall behind 6-2.

Neither team was able to score until the sixth inning when Goodland added a run and Burlington scored 2 to make it 8-3. Again in the seventh the Outlaws added 2 runs, but Burlington doubled that with 4

runs to win 12-5.

The Outlaws were behind 2-1 against Garden City in the first inning, and gave up 5 runs in the second and 4 in the third to fall behind 11-2. Garden City added a run in the fifth to win 12-2.

Other games on Saturday had Garden City winning the opening game 9-1 over Lakin. In the third game Burlington defeated WaKeeney 16-2. In the fourth game Burlington defeated Garden City 5-2.

On Sunday Burlington lost to Lakin 9-0 in the first game. In the third game Lakin defeated WaKeeney 8-0. In the Fourth game Garden City defeated WaKeeney 10-0.

Three Cowgirls make all league teams

Three members of the Goodland High School softball team made the all league team. Picked were Ashley Archer for pitcher, Brianna White for utility player and Hope Cochran for outfield. Named on the honorable mention list was Berkley White as honor-
