

Swimmers place third at Wray swim meet

The Goodland Swim Team was at Wray, Colo., on Saturday for its second meet of the season. The team won five individual gold medals and three relay teams were winners. The team came in third with 194 points. The Colby Swim Club was first with 233.5 and Wray was second with 212.5.

Dusty Johnson (11-12 boys) was a winner in all of his races. He won the 100-yard freestyle (1:10.78), 50-yard backstroke (36.49) and 50-yard breaststroke (41.62).

Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) won the 50-yard freestyle (25.05) and 100-yard backstroke (1:19.14). He placed second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:58.99).

The 11-12 boys 200-yard freestyle relay team were gold medal winners (2:14.32) with Johnson, Hagan Hoss, Levi House and Peyton Sieck swimming.

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard freestyle (2:37.34) and medley teams (3:03.00) came in first. Powell Sieck, Ellee McDaniel, Hannah Eslinger and Simon Bassett swam in the freestyle and Ellee McDaniel, Hannah Eslinger, Powell Sieck and Peyton Sieck swam in the medley.

The swim team will be in Oakley on Saturday.

In the 8 and under girls Olivia Bassett was sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (1:24.27).

In the 8 and under boys Ethan McDaniel was second in the 50-yard freestyle (45.27), second in the 25-yard freestyle (18.78) and second in the 25-yard backstroke (24.80) and Jared Stoffel was third in the 50-yard freestyle (47.70), third in the 25-yard freestyle (21.56) and second in the 25-yard breaststroke (25.96).

The 8 and under mixed relay was fourth with 100-yard freestyle (1:26.15) with Walker Eslinger, Vivian Solomon, Olivia Bassett and Athena Armstrong swimming.

In the 9-10 girls Rachel Hitman was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:35.37), second in the 25-yard backstroke (20.27) and third in the 25-yard breaststroke (25.96) and Peri Sieck was fourth in the 100-

yard freestyle (1:37.78) and sixth in the 25-yard butterfly (23.04).

The 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle relay was fourth (1:26.15) with Rebecca Lockhart, Teryn Teeter, Rachel Witman and Peri Sieck swimming.

The 9-10 girls 100-yard medley was fifth (1:46.36) with Rebecca Lockhart, Rachel Witman, Peri Sieck and Teryn Teeter swimming.

In 9-10 boys Ryan Volk was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:35.21) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (2:09.31).

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle relay was third (1:34.27) with Ethan McDaniel, Jared Stoffel, Ryan Volk and Savannah Solomon swimming.

In 11-12 girls Sianna Miller was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:20.68), sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (34.72) and fifth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:37.87); Kinsey Volk was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:25.64); Chalee Luther was fifth in the 50-yard backstroke (42.74); Mikayla Stoffel was fifth in the 50-yard breaststroke (48.39); Hannah Eslinger was sixth in the 50-yard breaststroke (48.39); and Ellee McDaniel was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:33.05).

In 13-14 girls Savannah Bassett was fourth in the 200-yard individual medley (3:36.84).

In 13-14 boys Aaron Avelar was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (32.27), third in the 100-yard backstroke (1:34.77) and third in the 200-yard individual medley (3:34.72).

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay was second (2:28.31) with Savannah Bassett, Lindsey Geeska, Makayla Kennedy and Aaron Avelar swimming.

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard medley was second (3:01.53) with Avelar, Kennedy, Savannah Bassett and Geeska swimming.

In 15-18 girls Taryn Bedore was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:04.17) and second in the 50-yard freestyle (27.89).

In 15-18 boys Holton Witman was third in the 50-yard freestyle (26.17), second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:20.56) and second in the 100-yard butterfly (1:18.86) and Tim Fugleburg was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (34.31).

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay was third (2:06.07) with Bonsall, Fugleberg, Bedore and Holton Witman swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley was second (2:18.93) with Bonsall, Bedore, Holton Witman and Fugleburg swimming.

Paetyn Barriclow also competed.

Oberlin Swim Club was fourth with 178.5 points in the meet, Holyoke, Colo. fifth with 156 points, Burlington Swim Team sixth with 150.5 points, Oakley Swim Team seventh with 47 points and Flagler, Neb., Swim Club eighth with 16 points.
