part of the 4x80m relay team that placed 18th in the nation with a time of 9:31.94.

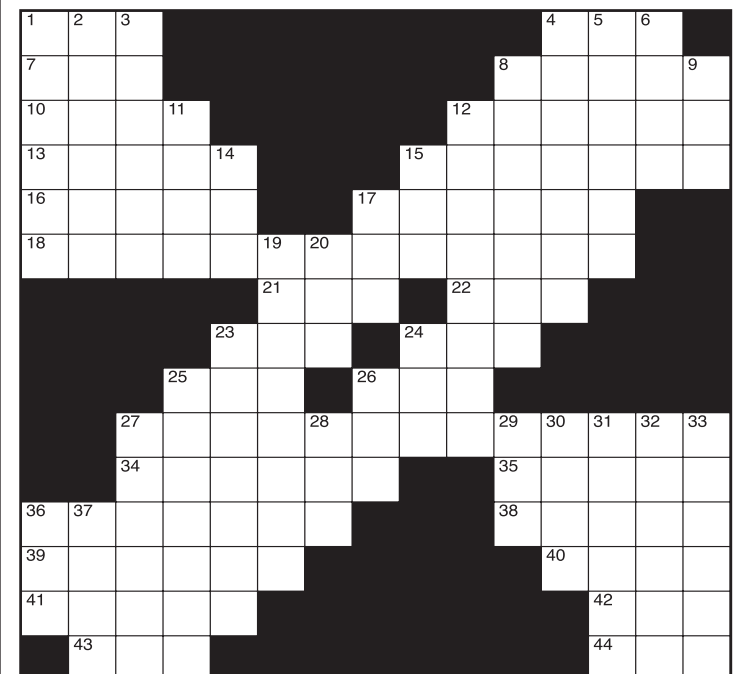
Dautel set six school records over her four years at the school. She set records on the 1500m with a time of 4:50.21 on May 9, 2009, at the Em-
