# Bíll E. Gannon

Longtime Sherman County, Kansas resident Bill E. Gannon, 84, died Monday, June 21, 2011, at Good Samaritan Society—Sherman County in Goodland.

He was born November 3. 1926, at Spur, Texas, the son of Lizzie Bell (Abbott) and William Robert Gannon. During his junior year at Spur High School, he entered the Merchant Marines and survived several torpedo attacks. He completed service to his country in the United States Army and was honorably discharged in May of 1947. He received his diploma in 1947 from Spur High School. He was quite a football player and was given military leave shortly after his

enlistment to play in the bidistrict championship game. While working on his brothers custom harvest crew, Bill came to Goodland and harvested wheat for Emil Veselik.
