## Large storm system hung over area Monday

and damaging tornados. Several smaller storms moved through in the morning before the larger system settled over the area in the afternoon. The earliest hit southern Thomas County with wind, rain

The largest storm of the day moved in from Colorado in the morning, passing over Garden City before moving north. Radar images showed the storm centering on Thomas County and rotating around as the storm moved north. northwest Kansas, southwest Nebraska and eastern Colorado in the afternoon.


