

Goodland swimmers place fourth at Oakley

The Goodland Swim Team was at Oakley on Saturday and placed fourth with 193 points. Swimmers took home seven individual and five relay gold medals.

The Colby Swim Club was first with 290 points, Wray Swim Club second with 215 and Oberlin was third with 199 points.

The swimmers will compete Saturday in Burlington and be at home in Goodland on Saturday, July 2.

Dusty Johnson set his second backstroke record of the season. Swimming in the 11-12 boys, he won 100-yard freestyle (1:11.87), 50-yard backstroke (36.43) and 50-yard breaststroke (42.57). He set a new pool record in the 50-yard backstroke.

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) won the 50-yard freestyle (27.74) and 100-yard butterfly (1:10.76) and placed second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:04.37).

Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) was a winner in the 50-yard freestyle (25.27) and 100-yard backstroke (1:17.81) and placed second in the 100-yard freestyle (58.44).

The five relay winners were the most this season. The 11-12 boys won both the 200-yard freestyle (2:13.27) and the 200-yard medley (2:50.77). Freestyle swimmers were Johnson, Hagan Hoss, Levi House, Peyton Sieck. Medley swimmers were Hoss, Simon Bassett, Powell Sieck and House.

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay (2:36.78) was first with Ryan Volk, Ellee McDaniel, Powell Sieck and Austin Hahn swimming.

Winning the 11-12 girls 200-yard medley relay (3:05.09) was Kinsey Volk, Mikayla Stoffel, Chalee Luther and Sianna Miller.

Finishing the day was the 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley relay taking first with swimmers Bonsall, Holton Witman, Bedore and Brooke Lockhart.

In 8 and under girls Sydney Hahn was third in the 25-yard backstroke (29.69).

The 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle team was fifth (2:39.02) with Olivia Bassett, Annika Linin, Athena Armstrong and Vivian Solomon swimming.

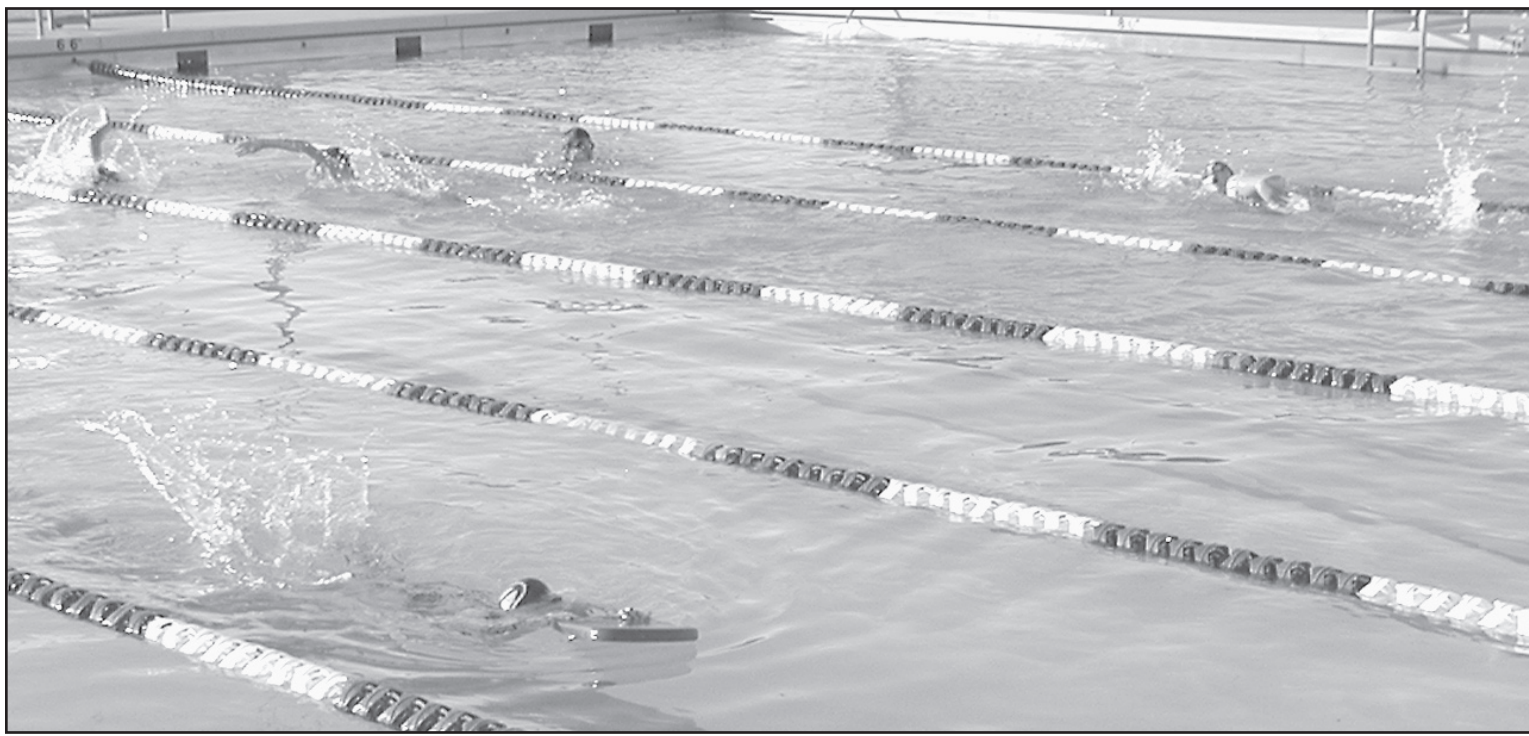
In 8 and under boys Ethan McDaniel was second in the 50-yard freestyle (46.94), second in the 25-yard freestyle (19.14) and second in the 25-yard backstroke (25.84) and Jared Stoffel was third in the 50-yard freestyle (49.27), fifth in the 25-yard backstroke (32.74) and second in the 25-yard breaststroke (27.87).

In 9-10 girls Peri Sieck was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:38.18) and second in the 25-yard butterfly (23.94).

In 9-10 boys Ryan Volk was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:31.40), third in the 25-yard butterfly (24.58) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (2:04.63), and Austin Hahn was fifth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:33.54) and third in the 25-yard breaststroke (24.84).

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle was fifth (1:45.55) with Jared Stoffel, Sydney Hahn, Ethan McDaniel and Savannah Solomon swimming.

was second (1:42.49) with Ehtan McDaniel, Jared Stoffel, Peri Sieck and Rebecca Lockhart swimming.

In 11-12 girls Sianna Miller was fifth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:24.90), sixth 50-yard freestyle (37.53) and fourth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:42.05) and Chalee Luther was fifth in the 50-yard backstroke (44.17).

The 11-12 girls 200-yard freestyle was third (2:29.12) with Kinsey Volk, Chalee Luther, Mikayla Stoffel and Sianna Miller swimming.

In 11-12 boys Hoss was second in

the 50-yard freestyle (32.90), second in the 50-yard butterfly (38.55) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (1:32.05); Simon Basset

was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:22.98), fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (35.68) and third in the 50-yard breaststroke (45.93); House was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:19.54), third in the 50-yard butterfly (45.01) and third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:32.78); Peyton Sieck sixth

in the 100-yard freestyle (1:24.53), sixth in the 50-yard butterfly (51.68) and fourth in the 100-yard individual

medley (1:43.22); and Powell Sieck fourth in the 50-yard butterfly (47.27) and fifth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:49.28).

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard medley was third (3:31.27) with Ellee McDaniel, Ryan Volk, Peyton Sieck and Austin Hahn swimming.

In 13-14 girls Makayla Kennedy was third in the 200-yard individual medley (3:56.89).

In 13-14 boys Aaron Avelar was fifth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:14.81), fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (32.90) and third in the 100-yard

backstroke (1:34.63).

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle was second (2:23.23) with Simon Bassett, Makayla Kennedy, Paetyn Barriclow and Aaron Avelar swimming.

In 15-18 boys Holton Witman was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:05.62), third in the 50-yard freestyle (27.50) and second in the 100-yard butterfly (1:13.62).

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard freestyle was fourth (2:03.91) with Bonsall, Shayley Miller, Brooke Lockhart and Holton Witman swimming.

Krush win 11 and under division at Wild West tournament

The Krush Baseball team went 3-2 to win the 11 and under division of the Wild West Baseball tournament in Dodge City last weekend.

The Krush will be in Holcolmb this weekend to finish out the month of June playing in a 2 day tournament there. The Krush season record now stands at 4-7.

In game one of the tournament the boys were able to avenge a loss from the previous weekend by beating the Dodge City Cubs 11-3.

Evan Peter picked up the win for the Krush throwing a complete game. Levi Archer was the leading hitter in game 1 going 2-3 with 1 run, and 1 RBI.

In game two the Krush found themselves facing another local team the Dodge City Outlaws. Krush pitcher

Darby Hays took the 12-6 loss to the Outlaws. Offensively the Krush were lead by Evan Peter going 3-3 with 4 RBI's.

Sunday morning in bracket play the Krush squared off with yet another Dodge City team the Young Guns. Taking the mound for his first game was Luis Ledesma, he picked up another Krush win in his 5 innings of work. Leading the way for the Krush with the bats was Brandt Mull going 3-3 with 2RBI's, Levi Archer 2-3 with 1 RBI and 1 Home run.

In game two of the double elimination bracket once again the Krush were set to face off with the Dodge City Rangers. Levi Archer lead the Krush on the mound against the Rangers for 4 innings before bring in Luis

Ledesma and Brandt Mull from the bull pin to try and shut down the hot bats of the Rangers. Krush was unable to pick up another win and lost to the Rangers 16-6, dropping them into the losers bracket.

This was a very big weekend for the Krush team, pool play was just teams from the 11 and under division, but on

Sunday when it came to bracket play they were combined with 12 and under teams. Though taking a hard loss to 12 and under opponent the Dodge City Rangers 16-6, the boys played very determined and never gave up. By winning the 11 and under division, they walked away with an overall third place finish amongst all teams in bracket play which included the 12 year old teams.

The Krush baseball team traveled to Dodge City for the MAST Cowboy Challenge on June 11.

Evan Peter took the mound for 4 innings against the Liberal Rattlers, but the Krush came up short 13-10. Leading the way at the plate was Dawson

Ensign going two for three with two doubles and three RBIs.

The Krush came out in the first inning and scored five consecutive runs giving them the early lead 5-0. The Rattlers exploded in the fifth inning scoring six runs on untimely defensive errors by the Krush.

Darby Hays appeared on the mound for two innings to try and shut down their bats but Liberal managed to put one more run on the board in the top of the sixth. The Krush still had one final opportunity at the plate heading into the bottom of the sixth inning down 9-13, Brandt Mull lead the way with a lead-off walk and was able to score, but the Krush bats couldn't find away

to catch up with the Liberal Rattlers falling 13-10.

In game two of the Cowboy Challenge The Krush faced home team Dodge City Cubs. Hays started on the hill for the Krush pitching four innings, with Peter coming in to finish the game. The Krush fell to the Cubs 9-8. Levi Archer, Chris Gamboa, Peter, Mull and Wence Hendrich all going 2-3 at the plate.

In the final game of the day Archer was the starting pitcher and Mull came in the fifth to finish up the game against Spearville Wind Dawgs. The Krush struggled on both sides of the ball losing the contest 12-3 to finish the MAST Cowboy Challenge 0-3.
